Commissioners honor Seven Lakes' Kay Hodge

The Moore County Board of Commissioners honored Seven Lakes North resident Kay Hodge for her service to the community at the regular commissioners meeting on Monday, December 5.

Hodge is a regular attendee at commissioners meetings, serving as an observer for the League of Women Voters of Moore County. In a resolution passsed at the December 5 meeting, commissioners recognized Hodge "for her outstanding level of professionalism, service and commitment while living in Moore County and on her impartial reporting on behalf of the Board of Commissioners."

Hodge and her husband Ken will be moving to River Landing at Sandy Ridge in Guilford County in January, so the December 5 commissioners meeting was Hodge's last as an official League observer.

Hodge has been a seemingly tireless volunteer for a variety of civic organizations since retiring to Seven Lakes, and the resolution passed by the board of commissioners recognizes that service explicitly.

Before asking Vice Chairperson Virginia Saunders to read the resolution honoring Hodge, Chairman David Cummings noted that "it is always always a pleasure to talk to Kay because she always has such a soft and kind voice. Sometimes we need a soft and kind voice."

SLLA Police vote underway

As *The Times* went to press early Thursday, approximately 500 members of the Seven Lakes Landowners Association [SLLA] had cast their vote in a binding referendum, to decide the fate of the Seven Lakes Company Police Department.

SLLA Community Manager Dalton Fulcher told *The Times* that he had tallied the number of votes cast on Wednesday morning and found a total of 490. He said that several landowners had come to the office to cast their vote after his morning count.

With three more days to go before the special meeting at which the final count will be taken, it's possible the turnout for the referendum could equal that of this year's annual meeting vote, which attracted 625 voters. Fulcher said a total of 1344 ballots had been sent out.

A less than 50 percent turnout for the special referendum could

be viewed as surprisingly low, given that a September poll on Company Police conducted by the Concerned Citizens' Council — a poll viewed by many as flawed — attracted nearly 600 responses.

The special meeting ballot asks voters to select one of three options: maintaining company police, disbanding company police but retaining 120 hours per week of security patrol, or disbanding company police and limiting security patrol to 80 hours per week.

If voters choose to eliminate company police, that decision will take effect at the end of the current SLLA fiscal year, on April 30, 2006.

The elections committee charged with counting the vote includes Len Barnard, Mike Cummings, JoAn Moses, and Bud Shaver, who will also serve

Trailer fees: debate that didn't happen

It was clear that some in the audience were itching for a fight or a least a good, old-fashioned town hall meeting — on the subject of proposed parking fees for trailers and recreational vehicles at the new Seven Lakes West trailer storage facility.

But, whether it was the good will of the season or the skillful parries of Seven Lakes West Landowners Association [SLWLA] President Jim Meikle, the shouting match never materialized during the Tuesday, November 29 meeting of the association.

During the October SLWLA meeting, Ray MacKay unveiled the proposed charges for use of the lot: \$120 per year for trailers and \$300 for RVs. As is its policy, the board is now in the process of collecting written comments on the proposed fees and other aspects of the proposed storage lot rules.

Meikle said the board has







At she celebrates the shop's first anniversary, Malarchick told The Times those twelve months have been marked by steady growth in the range and depth of items offered.

"I started in just the front room a couple of tables and a display case — but now I have two full rooms of items on display," Malarchick said. And more growth is on the horizon, as she expands further into the space available at her West End location and adds more furniture and home furnishings.

Malarchick said she selects items for the store - and its overall product mix — by listening to her customers. Noting that she has a great selection of tea cups, she told The Times she initially thought of locating a tea room in the shop, but customers

'Books West' hosts author Katie Kelly

Katie Kelly, journalist, television commentator and author, was the guest speaker of the Books West book club of Seven Lakes Monday, November 21, at the Seven Lakes North Clubhouse. Kelly, who is a cousin of Seven Lakes resident, Joe Fellingham, has worked as a writer for *Time Magazine*, has been a television critic for the *New York Post*, an on-air movie and theatre critic for WNBC-TV (New York), TV critic for "The Today Show," movie

critic on "The Morning Show" with Regis Philbin and Kathie Lee Gifford, and movie critic for "Entertainment Tonight."

Her books include *The Wonderful World of Women's Wear Daily* (1972), *My Prime Time: Confessions of a TV Watcher* (1973), *A Year in Saigon* (1992), and *The Kellys: A Midwestern Memoir* (2004).

The Books West book club had chosen *A Year in Saigon*

as the November selection. Fran Fellingham, a member of the book club, invited Katie to travel from her home in Nebraska to be the book club's guest speaker. Katie agreed and gave a talk and slide presentation to members of Books West as well as four other Seven Lakes book clubs: Bookies, Bookies II, Turning Leaves, and Happy Bookers.

In 1988, Katie Kelly took a vacation in Vietnam that was to

become the first step of a larger journey. That Christmas in Ho Chi Minh City, she met many Amerasian children, some of them selling peanuts, postcards and cigarettes to tourists. Kelly returned to New York but she could not forget the young casualties of the Vietnam War.

In early 1990, she took a year off of her job with NBC, packed her bags, gathered what few educational supplies she could find, and flew to Saigon. With some teaching experience and a lot of gumption, Kelly set off to aid these forgotten children, many of them homeless and

barely getting enough food to survive. A Year in Saigon is a sprightly account of her 1990 stint teaching in improvised sites, such as restaurants, parks, and homes. Her involvement with the students went far beyond English lessons. She became, as they called her, their "American Mama."

In her Books West presentation, Kelly gave follow-up on what has become of these children. Most of them are now living happy and successful lives in the United States. She helped make many of those children's dreams a reality.





Trailer lot: money has to come from somewhere

Dear Editor,

The recent letter (November 23rd issue) concerning the projected cost of a trailer parking yard, uses sarcasm to make the writer's point.

Unfortunately, it also shows a lack of understanding of how a community must function in order to accomplish needed goals for the residents.

It is easy to complain.

It is a lot harder to examine the problem and come up with solutions.

We currently have between 300 and 400 RV's and trailers of various descriptions located within Seven Lakes West. That's about one trailer for every two houses and we are growing at a rate of 80 to 100 new homes a

Assuming that we don't want to have these vehicles (and the boats that come with them) parked in our neighbor's yards, we have to provide space to store them.

To provide a place to store

them costs money. The two acre trailer yard is well beyond capacity. The Board voted to expand it in August of 2003 when we initially negotiated for the additional acreage.

Your Board has two avenues available to raise the funds necessary to provide for this storage, or for any other community capital improvement, for that matter.

- 1. The Board can call for a special assessment of all members
- 2. they can charge a users fee. Generally, assessments are enacted when the proposed improvement benefits all the members and a user fee is based on limited benefit to the member-

To suggest, even sarcastically, that user fees should be charged to use the tennis courts, playground, pool and other community amenities ignores the financial benefit the WSC Park accrues to every property owner. (Why do you suppose the developer touted the Community Center in his ads as soon as it was open? But that's a whole different issue, isn't it.)

It is really a simple proposition. If something is needed in the community, it has to be paid for by all or by those who need the service. Sure, it would be better to have a one time \$80 assessment of the membership than for me to pay an annual user fee.

And the community as a whole does benefit by not having hundreds of trailers parked on lots all over so you could argue the case for either method.

And yet, I believe it is fairer for me, the trailer owner, to pay a parking fee than to assess everyone in this case.

So, user fee or assessment. Which do you prefer?

The fact to be faced is that the money has to come from somewhere.

Which do you think is the fairer means of raising it?

Board's numbers on police don't add up

The Seven Lakes Landowners Association Board had two items in their Advertisement in the recent issue of the Seven Lakes Times that I wish to discuss.

First, the ad, under Option 1,

states that the total cost for 120 hours of patrol by two police officers (80 hours) and 40 hours from security would cost \$116,382. My calculations show this 120 hours would cost about \$144,000. The difference would

Why the difference?

My figures include, just for two police officers:

1. Salaries \$79,178 2. Two cars \$10,000

3. FICA \$6,120 this is a cost of social secu-

- 4. Group Insurance \$10,000 this is Health Insurance.
- \$2,698 this may mean Individual Retirement Account.
- 6. Expenses \$9.000 this is the share I believe should be applied to these people out of a total cost of \$31,000 in expenses for the Police/Security Dept.

The difference between the Board's figure and mine is \$27.818.

mean a savings of \$27,618. savings to we Landowners if we adopt Option 3 instead of Option 1 would be:



Cost of option 1 - \$144,000minus cost of Option 3 — \$54,414 - leaves \$89,586.

If we use just one patrol car we save another \$5,000, or a total of \$94,000 per year. This money could be put in a reserve fund to provide most of the additional \$700,000 we would need for road paving in seven years.

If we do not pave for 10 years we have a total of most of the \$1 million dollars needed for our

The second issue is crime. The board states in its ad: "We have crime be it drugs, vandalism" etc, etc. etc. I do not believe these comments!

It may have been true before. but not since our Security Committee under the leadership of Loren Swearingen took action this past year.

For a while it looked like FEMA would arbitrarily reclassify all our lakefront home sites as floodplain. Thanks to Tony and the Board, that legal problem went away. That does not mean

that there is no potential danger.

Our lake begins to overflow when the water level reaches the overflow pipe at an elevation of 525 ft. Overwhelming rains (or blockage of that pipe) could raise the lake level another 2 feet before it flows over the emergency spillway at the end of the dam.

What almost everyone fails to realize is that the tropical storm force winds we could have from the remnants of a passing hurricane would push enough water across the lake to raise the level another 1 foot on the windward shore. That could be any side of the lake, depending on the path of the storm. Then. add at least two foot waves on top of that, and the breaking waves could reach 4 feet above lake full level.

That's why our rules require the lowest finished level of all lakefront homes to be at least 5 feet above lake level. Unfortunately, there are some that are not. While the chances of flooding are very small, the consequences would be costly. If you have any possibility of being flooded, consider flood insurance.

The fact that your home is not officially in a flood zone will make the cost of flood insurance much cheaper. Don't expect me or the Lake Director to open the big drain valve if the water rises. It was not designed for that purpose, nor would it be even possible to open it under those conditions.

The water clarity in October was 17 feet vertical visibility. That is just slightly clearer than normal, which has been running between 15 and 16.5 ft. for October. During most months this year the water has been slightly clearer than normal, except for August, which was 12 ft. compared with the typical
