New well passes test for radium

Residents of Seven Lakes and Pinehurst may have an additional half million gallons of water at their disposal — the product of a new well on Pinehurst Resort's storied Number 2 golf course.

A test well on the site dubbed "5A" has produced water free of contaminants, Marcus Jones, Moore County's Director of Public Utilities, told members of the county Board of Commissioners during their January 16 work session in the historic court house in Carthage.

Well 5A was drilled after high radium concentrations forced the county to close Well 5 nearby — costing the water system that serves Pinehurst and Seven Lakes 500,000 gallons of supply per day. Well 5 was pulled out of service in February 2005.

Water from the new well has tested at one picoCurie per liter, well below the five picoCurie per liter recommended maximum, Jones told Commission-

After the meeting, Jones told The Times that the plan is to drill a production well on the site and bring it online before next summer's dry season.

The radium contaminating wells throughout the county system occurs naturally in soil layers, and is dissolved when it comes into contact with the well water. Newer well construction technology can minimize this problem, Jones told The Times.

Harsany resigns from **Foxfire Village Council**

Veteran Foxfire Village Councilman Joe Harsanv surprised both members of the public and his fellow council members when he resigned his post at the conclusion of the Tuesday, January 9 Council meeting.

Harsany asked early to reserve time at its conclusion to speak. He used that time to announce that he would be leaving the council, effective immediately, citing personal reasons.

It's a longstanding tradition that Harsany brings each Foxfire Council meeting to an end with motion to adjourn - and Mayor George Erickson apparently thought that was just what Harsany had done on Tuesday

Erickson gaveled the meeting to a close without realizing that Harsany had resigned, but Village Clerk Janice Thomas caught the import of Harsany's con-

cluding remarks.

"He just resigned," she told Erickson. Then she asked Harsany to clarify that he had indeed resigned.

Harsany has served on the panel for nine years and has focused considerable time and effort on improving the Village's water system — effort that is bearing fruit during the current Village construction boom.

The standard practice in the Village is for the remaining council members to appoint someone to fill out the term of a member who leaves the board.


Hernandez received a \$25,000 secured bond and was placed in the Moore County Detention Center.

Area A panel drafts mission statement

[The Times was unable to attend the January 9 meeting of the Area A Small Area Plan Steering Committee. The group's Chairman, Dave Kinney of Seven Lakes, kindly provided this report of the group's work.]

The Area "A" Small Area Plan Steering Committee held its third meeting Tuesday evening, Januarv 9th.

Craven Hudson, the Director of Moore County Cooperative Extension, facilitated the writing of the committee's mission statement.

The idea was to develop a broad statement of purpose that captures what the group is doing. In previous meetings, committee members had suggested elements and wording that could be included in the final statement.

After some lively discussion on the best wording, the committee agreed on the following:

"Through community involvement, develop a dynamic twenty-year plan that values the past and manages growth while enhancing the essential character of the area."

Chairman Kinney then laid out the group's work plan for the next several months.

The first step was to outline and staff three subcommittees suggested by work done in the group's two earlier meetings.

At the committee's initial meeting members were asked to answer the question: "Why are you here, why did you want to serve in this endeavor?"

The answers included approximately forty separate items, which fell logically into one of three groups of issues: preservation, growth management, and infrastructure.

These issue groups became the basis for three subcommittees, each with a chairperson, a defined task, and a county planner to serve as a resource for the committee's work.

The committees, their assigned task, and members, are:

Preservation -

Task: Identify the hard assets (in contrast to intangible assets, characteristics) Area A has and values: recommend and prioritize those tangible assets to be preserved, and how to do it.

Members: John Monroe, Chair;

Watts Auman; Judy Boroughs; strong, Planner. Don Welch; and Chris Arm- Growth management —

prioritize the kinds of growth

SLLA Governance – A better way forward

I sincerely hope that this article will prompt an immediate reply from our community. I elicit your opinion on the Board's current practice of conducting "work sessions" on Thursday afternoons and "general meetings" on the following Wednesday evenings. I am concerned that we are excluding a significant population of those working folks who are the basis of our changing demographics. As elected representatives, we are obligated to conduct our business in an open and transparent manner. We cannot earn your confidence if we continue to meet and decide

to our membership and without public participation.

MEMO:

During my first 10 months on this Board, I have calculated the following. We have met on 10 Thursday work ses-

sions and our audience has averaged three members of the community; the "audience", however, was mostly the same three residents. At these sessions,

the Board has taken about 70

issues at a time inconvenient votes on all kinds of issues, so our discussions and deliberations on spending and other issues were not heard by the

other 1200 members of our community. This is not openness.

On the other hand, each of the 10 general meetings on Wednes-

days averaged about thirty residents. At these meetings, the audience was "told" what the Board decided the week before! No discussion. No voting. No public input on the issues.

We have traditionally conducted business in this way and, in my opinion, this has to change. We are a not-for-profit corporation functioning as a private government. We are using the governance model for for-profit corporations where many decisions are taken behind closed doors. Although our work sessions are technically "open" to the public, we effectively discourage attendance by meeting at an inconvenient time. I would like to see us move more toward a public model with all decisions (voting) taken only after two readings, one after the initial

motion and the final vote after the second reading.

What I am proposing is the following. All Board meetings, the work sessions and the general sessions, will be held on Wednesday evenings. Voting on issues will take place after the second reading on the last Wednesday of each month. This will allow more member input. Public comments should also precede board discussion at all meetings.

As with any change, opposition is expected. Only you, the public, can make this possible. Let me know if you agree with what I am proposing by dropping me a line at cenuti@nc.rr.com or call me at 673-7565. Then come out to our January 31st general meeting and make your comments heard.



Roads, village plan top Guild's 2007 agenda

Planning for the future of Seven Lakes Business Village and, specifically, the future of its roads, are at the top of the agenda for the Seven Lakes Business Guild as it looks forward in the New Year.

The Guild's new President. Les Murray of Big Sky Construction, and former President Phil Cook of Carolina Car Care, who now serves as the Chairman of the Guild Board, told The Times that the Guild's "Village Tomorrow" project and the attempt to turn village streets over to the North Carolina Department of Transportation are the most important items on the Guild's todo list for 2007.

"Village Tomorrow" is a planning process the Guild began last year. The goal is to develop a vision of what the Business Village should look in the future - how, ideally, it should develop as new businesses move in. This "micro-planning" process will ultimately feed into Moore County's Small Area Planning process for the area surrounding Seven Lakes and West End, Murray told The Times.

Village Tomorrow committees were formed last year to study three key areas — Architectural Standards & Landscaping; Signage; and Land Use. Murray said that it is now time to get those committees moving forward with their work.

acquired title to most of the streets in the village, which had previously be owned by a moribund corporation that was part of the fallout from the original development company's bankruptcy. The Guild has been maintaining the roads — filling potholes and repaving sections — for more than a decade, even though it did not own the roads.

With the ownership issue resolved, the Guild had the roads tested to see whether they were constructed to the state standards in place at the time they were built.

Cook told The Times that the results of those tests are expect-

Traffic study finds few, but serious, speeders

We have completed our first traffic study. The purpose of this study and all future studies is to identify areas when speeding is a consistent problem and to justify corrective action that may need to be taken.

The first study began on December 13 at 3:00 pm and ended on December 14 at 11:00 pm. The survey recorded traffic in both directions.

As a result of our first study we learned several important facts. The study needs to last for a longer period of time than two days. In order to confirm traffic patterns we will have to go back to each location to see if we can establish any trends.

The information we collected

however was very encouraging. There were a 291 cars traveling eastbound and 389 cars traveling westbound — a

total of 680 cars.

Of this total there were only 7 (2.4%) motorists traveling eastbound and 19 (4.8%) motorists travel-

ing westbound where law enforcement action would have been required. This represents a total of 26 vehicles or 3.8% of the total number of cars. This is the good news.

The bad news we had four motorists traveling at speeds in

excess of 50 miles per hour. This is unacceptable.

We have almost 600 hundred children living in Seven Lakes.







Historic Carthage Legion Post gets a facelift

Moore County's oldest American Legion post is getting a complete makeover, with hopes that it can become a resource for Legionnaires countywide.

Elmer Hall, Adjutant Treasurer of the Legion's Joseph G. Hinson Post 12 in Carthage, and longtime post member Paul Greene recently gave *The Times* a tour of the construction site, and provided a little history of the Post, as well.

The Legion Building sits just south of downtown Carthage, at the intersection of Legion Hut Road and Shady Lane Road. It was moved there in 1960, after Post 12's leaders acquired it from Fort Bragg, cut it into three pieces, and moved it by truck to Carthage. Built during World War I, it served as an administrative office for the military installation.

After the move to Carthage, it hosted not only Legion meetings, but a wide range of community events, including barbecue dinners cooked in the big barbecue pit out back, built by WWI and WWII vets who were the stalwarts of the post at the time.

The interior was paneled in cypress and yellow pine, as were many buildings built in the South in '10s and '20s.

Unfortunately, nearly a century later, those boards had become too brittle to salvage in the current renovation, which includes both insulating and rewiring the facility. A trophy case will preserve some of the original woodwork.

In addition to insulation, wiring, new windows, new sheetrock, new carpet, and refinishing the

original hardwood floors, the Post's renovation includes a built-in state of the art public address system, which will make the room ideal for those who would like to rent it for weddings, parties, and community gatherings, Hall told *The Times*.

In addition, it is hoped that the centrally-located post can become a resource for Legion posts across the county.

Hall told *The Times* that membership in veterans' organizations — the American Legion included — is rapidly shrinking, as veterans from the WWII generation pass away and the organizations have trouble attracting younger vets.

He said a recent study conducted by a researcher at Fort Bragg predicted that, unless the trend is reversed, there may be no veterans' organizations by 2020.

The Carthage post already attracts members from across the county, and Hall said there is some interest in consolidating the half-dozen Moore County Legion Posts into a single unit — perhaps using the newly-remodeled Carthage facility as its home.

Post 12 currently has 80 members, including six who were recently recognized for 60 years of continuous service.

Though the current remodeling project has put a hiatus on general meetings, the Post traditionally meets at 7:00 pm on the

second Thursday of the month. In addition to the business meeting, a potluck supper is often on the agenda, featuring food prepared by the Legion Auxiliary

"And we have got some good cooks," Hall told *The Times*. "These ladies are southern cooks and they bring in some good food!"

In addition to reviving those potlucks, Hall said the Post hopes to provide a meeting place

and support for a scout troop and, hopefully, raise enough funds to support a Legion youth baseball team.

Like many Legion Posts, Post 12 is named for a fallen vet. Joseph G. Hinson was the first Moore Countian to give his life for his country in World War I.

Now's the time to plant trees and shrubs

Can you believe it, it's January 2007....beautiful warm weather and cool nights with little or no signs of winter. In fact, some plants and trees are beginning to bud and indicate breaking dormancy.

Don't be surprised if the first green tips of daffodil bulbs emerge. The earlier planted ones are on schedule. The weather is unpredictable. It can change suddenly. At this time of year, there still is a chance we might or can have a late winter. These beautiful days give many of us the urge to go outside and begin the gardening year.

A number of inquiries have been made since Christmas concerning the planting and transplanting of shrubs. Now is an ideal time for planning and moving plants because weather conditions have perhaps never been more favorable.

Soil moisture and temperatures are excellent and plants are fully dormant; therefore, go ahead and plant many deciduous and evergreen shrubs and trees.

Plant when the soil isn't frozen and be sure to water all plantings well at planting. Plant each specimen according to its desired growing area. Some require shade, some are adapted to partial sun, and Crape myrtles should be planted in full sun for proper growth and flowering. Also a sunny planting location will help control powdery mildew and aphid infestations.

Let's review a few shrub planting procedures. First, well prepare the soil in the growing area where the plant will be planted. Spade out or till up a large enough root zone planting area to accommodate the plant size. Larger plants and transplants may require a four to five foot growing space outside the rootball

During the planting process, add dried, processed cow manure, organic matter, peat moss, compost, phosphorous, or any other organic fertilizer amendment and incorporate it in and around the planting hole site. Water all plantings well and weekly thereafter.

Prune all transplants, cutting about half of the top to bring down the above ground top in line with the root and stem systems and fertilize the fresh transplants



when new growth begins.

It is important to go through the detailed process of planting and transplanting because more plants are lost due to improper planting than any other reason.

Here are a few

timely suggested tasks which hopefully will be helpful for January.

If you have failed to prune those non-blooming

spring flowering plants, now is a good time to do it. Also, start pruning summer blooming plants.

Winter weeds such as chickweed, dandelions, henbit, wild onions, garlic, etc, are beginning to become a problem. Control them by cutting them.

Join and support your local community garden club. It's a good method for receiving gardening information. Also, the tips contribute to the overall beauty of the Sandhills.

If you haven't done it, winterize your shrubs and other coldsusceptible plants with two, but not more than three, inches of pine straw, pine bark, or other mulch.

Fertilize your pansies now

and again when needed with a premium liquid or granular slow release fertilizer.

Don't forget to service and sharpen your lawn mower blades and clean up all your garden tools.

Now that deciduous leaf shedding is essentially completed, one can finish cutting down those unwanted hardwoods and other trees.

January is a good time to outline new flower beds and plan for the coming season.



duce blindness, is caused by an increased pressure in the eye. This deprives one's peripheral vision.

Also discussed during the meeting was Macular Degeneration, which affects the center of the retina and, therefore, the center of your vision, although peripheral vision remains. There is no known cure for this condition.

Dr. White also touched upon eye problems connected to diabetes and surgical procedures available for far less serious conditions such as cosmetic or vision improvement.

The Bylaws are mute on the subject. The monthly General Meeting is an open information session of the full Board with opportunity for member input, often leading into productive dialogue with the Board. In the past, these sessions were not run as formal Board meetings, and never was Board business done

in these meetings.

The recent amendment to the NC Planned Community Act [NC-PCA] requires a regular opportunity for members to speak to their Board. So our Board reclassified the Gen-

live already in this new world. In some other states, laws are pending.

Why should the SLWLA wait till North Carolina law forces the change?

In matters of file access for

members we were perfect from the start: Our bylaws allow all members full access to the Association's files and records. Let's do the next step: access to all meetings of our quasi-government

It will improve communication and the flow of ideas. It even may improve decisions, the minutes and the civility of Board meetings. And there may be a bonus: Seven Lakes North experienced a shortening of the Board sessions when they opened them some years ago. Members interested in cooperation or with special skills would be welcome to quietly sit-in. They could, as I experienced in government meetings, even be invited to comment on an agenda item.

They could get a feel whether they could help the Association by joining the respective group. Members of our committees could now see how their recommendations are handled by the Board and hopefully understand and support the decisions, or have reason to later try to correct a misunderstanding or misrepresentation.

All this interaction can only help on the way to good government.

It is self-understood that not only the Board, but even some committees will have to protect certain matters by going into closed "executive session" without public minutes: personnel, litigation risk, purchasing/pricing,

land acquisition. The state laws mentioned above provide good examples of how to define such exceptions.

Increasing participation of the citizen is a long term trend in government. More and more government decisions require hearings with outside experts and the public; freedom of information acts are providing access to government files; C-Span is transmitting 24/7 on two channels Washington's parliamentary proceedings, hearings and more, and is not shy of controversial subjects; the Moore County Board of Commissioners is contemplating to accept even the local TV's participation in its meetings.

I cannot attend our Board's work sessions, but Open Meeting laws provide that I can, and I did, participate in work sessions of the County Commissioners, the Pinehurst Village Council, the County Planning Department and the Subdivision Review Board.

Is it detrimental to the quality of these government activities? Certainly not.

Is it helping me to influence what is going on? In humble small steps, yes.

Our two Landowners Associations in Seven Lakes are what is commonly called "private governments." They fulfill govern-

ment-like functions, have the respective powers, and we elect our leadership. Our small neighbor Foxfire, being incorporated, performs its functions in its Village government under NC's open meeting rules.

Our large neighbor Seven Lakes North/South has opened its Board of Directors meetings to the public.

Let's join.





Though most of Seven Lakes' wells are also contaminated, its is unlikely the county will attempt to drill new ones to replace them, since wells in that part of the county are less productive — and therefore less economical — than wells drilled near Pinehurst.

Water study still under review. The jury's still out on a comprehensive county-wide water study in the works since June 2005.

Jones provided additional background on the history of and planning for the study during Tuesday's work session. Commissioners listened attentively but made no comment.

A number of commissioners, including Larry Caddell, Jimmy Melton, and Colin McKenzie, expressed skepticism about the need for, cost of, and chosen supplier of the proposed study during their January 2 meeting.

The previous board of commissioners approved the selection of the engineering firm McGill and Associates as vendor for the study after a committee that brought together representatives of municipalities throughout the county unanimously recommended the firm.

Jones explained that the idea of a comprehensive study of county water needs, resources, and financing options was first approved by the board of commissioners in June of 2005. While the county was in the early stages of planning that study, the Moore County Summit made a comprehensive countywide water study one of its priorities. The Summit is an ad hoc group that promotes intergovernmental cooperation and planning.

The county study expanded in scope to include participation by the county's municipalities, which would help design, fund, and reap the results of the study.

Jones said all but two of the county's towns and cities had signed on to participate in the study — Foxfire and Taylortown

Advertise in The Times Call 673-0111 being the holdouts. He expressed confidence that those towns could be brought on board once they had a better understanding of the goals of the study.

The scope of the study has now been developed and a contract is in hand for approval by the Board of Commissioners, Jones said. He told The Times after the meeting that he hopes that approval can be placed on the agenda for the Commissioners' February 5 meeting.

Other items

Moving from their work session directly into their regular meeting, Commissioners received the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report from the independent audit firm Dixon Hughs.

The firm's Scott Brewer said an audit of the county's financial records for Fiscal Year 2005-2006 yielded "a clean opinion with no exceptions."

He praised the work of County Finance Officer Lisa Hughes and her staff for their work in remedying trouble spots pointed out in last year's audit — items like the control of access to county gasoline pumps and implementing a write-off policy for Health Department patient receivables.

The firm highlighted several opportunities for fine-tuning county financial controls in its new report; Hughes provided commissioners with an action plan addressing each of those items.

"We don't dread the time that the auditors come," Hughes told the Commissioners. "We look forward to their review . . . They are helping us make our county and our department much stronger."

In other business, the Board of Commissioners:

- Approved a new process for evaluating requests from municipalities that went to expand their extraterritorial zoning jurisdictions.
- Awarded a contract for digital orthophotography — commonly called "aerial photography" — of the county, as well

as contracts or contract modifications involving a wastewater lift station and an ATM on County property at the former Carriage Oaks Shopping Center.

- Granted \$20,000 to one company and \$5,000 to another to assist with relocations of the firms to Moore County.
- Agreed to host a January 24
 Transportation Summit meeting aimed at gathering input from all county municipalities on the North Carolina Department of Transportation's long-term plan for road and highway improvements in the county.



Parks and Recreation Trust Fund

[The Times was unable to attend this portion of the Council meeting and so has relied on draft minutes prepared by Clerk Thomas for portions of our report.]

The village received a PARTF grant two years ago to fund the construction of the Village Green municipal park and applied last year for a grant to help fund the overhaul of the swimming pool and tennis court complex. That second applicatoin was unsuccessful.

Tuesday night's public meeting was aimed at gathering public input before the counil voted to submit an updated application for the pool and tennis court project to PARTF for this year's round of funding.

The project is expected to cost just under \$600,000; the village is asking that PARTF pay half of that cost.

After gathering input during the public meeting, the council later approved three resolutions necessary to put the new grant application in motion.

Zoning. There are currently 47 homes under construction in Foxfire — 38 in the village proper and 9 in the extraterritorial jurisdiction, Zoning Adminstrator Frank Holloway reported.

Finance. Councilman Wally Peckitt reported that the Village has spent just under \$250,000 of its \$480,000 operating budget for the 2006-2007 Fiscal Year.

The village has \$334,000 on hand in the General Fund and \$45,500 on hand in the water fund. There is \$106,000 in a special capital fund for the Water Department.

Public Safety. The village has thus far had little luck in finding applicants interested in replacing Police Chief Rick Rhyne, who announced his retirement in December, Councilman Carl Munro reported.

Despite advertising for the position, no applications for the chief's position have been submitted — and a vacancy for a patrol officer attracted on three sub-par applications, he said.

Munro asked and received council approval to spend not more than \$1,250 to place additional advertisements in newspapers serving communities in the region.

Asked about the selection process, Munro explained that an eight-member committee which has yet to meet - will evaluate applicants for both positions. Munro said the names of

committee members are being kept secret so that they will not be badgered by the public.


A number of residents expressed support for hiring current Village police officer Mike Campbell as Chief of Police.

Munro said Campbell had not yet applied for the position. Council man Peckitt encouraged residents interested in seeing Campbell get the job write letters in support of that to the Council.

Village Green. Councilman Gene Petrie reported on construction progress at Village Green, noting that contributions will be sought to fund tables and benches for the picnic shelters. The tables and benches cost approximately \$800 each.

Well site. Mayor Erickson asked for and received council approval to make two separate offers on property needed for a new well site, for a total cost of \$30,000.

ed in the next few weeks. If all goes according to plans, the Guild will be able to turn the streets over to NCDOT, which will

then be responsible for maintaining them.

In addition to these big projects, Murray and Cook said the Guild has several new initiatives in the works - as well as some events that have become community traditions:

• Guild Website. Construction of a Seven Lakes Business Guild website is well underway with the finished product expected to debut in February. As well as providing information about the guild, the website will provide low-cost advertising to Guild members.

- Brochure. Harris Printing has a Guild brochure in the works that will help explain the benefits of Guild membership.
- Community Events. The Guild traditionally sponsors "Meet the Merchants" and a holiday tree-lighting that bring out large crowds of residents for a fun evening. The Guild has also sponsored a Service to Seven Lakes Expo in the Spring. In addition, the annual President's Cup golf tournament serves as a fund-raiser for Guild projects like the recent testing of village roads.

She served as a member of the Fayetteville City Council before retiring to Seven Lakes.

Her withdrawal from the race leaves Dale Erickson, Jim Haggard, Kathy Kirst, Jim Meikle, and Ed Tuton in the running for one of the three open board seats.

Zielsdorf was mentioned as a possible candidate in at least one work session of the the SLLA Board, but, when Nominating Committee Chairman Steve Hudson announced the slate of board-nominated candidates in the SLLA's December 13 general meeting, Zielsdorf's name was not on the list.

Under SLLA by-laws, any resident member in good standing can have his or her named added to the ballot by submitting a petition signed by at least five percent of members in good standing. Zielsdorf told *The Times* that he expects to meet that standard. The petition must be submitted during the January general meeting of the association, scheduled for Wednesday evening, January 28.

Zielsdorf has lived in Seven Lakes North for almost seven years, he told *The Times*; his mother and father moved to the community more than 20 years ago and his mother continues to reside in Seven Lakes North.

a math instructor at Montgomery Community College in nearby Troy. He holds a Bachelors of Science degree in Math education from Edinboro University in Pennsylvania and a Masters in Biomedical Engineering from UNC-Chapel Hill.

Zielsdorf worked nearly 20 years as an engineer; the last nine running his own firm.

He told *The Times* that he decided to run for the board for several reasons, chief among them a concern about how the board is spending member's money. Zielsdorf said that large expenditures on the horizon—the need for street repaving and the possibility of repairs to community dams—calls for an emphasis on saving for those long-range projects rather than spending on new bells and whistles.

"I believe Seven Lakes should have a better system of checks and balances on how membership money is spent," he told *The Times*. Among the ideas he favors is requiring membership approval of expenditures above a certain dollar amount and developing a "rainy day fund," that would be built up to help pay for major unanticipated expenses.

Zielsdorf said he sees at least three major groups of residents in Seven Lakes: the original retirees who have been here 20 years or so, younger retirees just moving in, and young families with full-time jobs and schoolage children.

"To represent all these groups, it wouldn't hurt to have a slightly different mindset on the board," he told *The Times*, noting that he fit into the third, working-age group.

Zielsdorf said he understood that his name may have been dropped from the list of nominating committee candidates because his teaching schedule at Montgomery Community College conflicts with the once-amonth Thursday afternoon SLLA Board work sessions.

Zielsdorf told *The Times* that his teaching schedule is relatively flexible. Noting that the scheduling of the work session is a matter of tradition rather than anything prescribed in the by-laws, Zielsdorf said, "If the current board can't accommodate my schedule, then they probably can't accommodate anyone who still works for a living."

He said he was glad, in retrospect, that he had been forced to seek signatures for his petition. "It was definitely worth my time to go out and talk with the folks in Seven Lakes," Zielsdorf said. "I found it very beneficial." Lakers who would like to support Zielsdorf's attempt to win a spot on the ballot may telephone him

at 673-9333.

Assuming his petition is in order, Zielsdorf's name will join those of Laura Douglass, Frank McKenna, Donna Stephan, Loren Swearingen, and Don Truesdell on the ballot for the SLLA election, which will be decided at the annual meeting in late March.

desired, where it is not: recommend how to make it happen, how to manage it.

Task: Identify, recommend and prioritize improvements necessary to support the desired growth in Area A with the least adverse effect on what is to be preserved: make first cut at estimating investment and on-going

Members: Nancy Fiorillo, Chair; Elaine Girgis; Cindy Holland; and Ray Mackay.

The committees were challenged to dream — "If you can't dream it, it can't happen," Kinney told the group - and, at the same time, to be realistic in developing recommendations.

They were asked to "think outside the box" and avoid "it's never been done before."

"You can't move ahead without making waves," Kinney said.

They were challenged to develop recommendations that are specific and actionable, avoiding generalities.

Integrated, consistent recommendations, supportive of one another, are absolutely essential to developing a plan that, without reservation, will permit the community to say "mission accomplished" when the committees work is done, Kinney said.

Each committee accepted its assigned task and agreed to meet frequently over the coming months to complete its work.

Each committee was given a list of data, information and maps needed in their work, as well as a list of experts and resources to provide their experience and special knowledge.

To provide a graphic illustration of the role of the committees within the overall planning process, the committees were first shown as three independent, isolated — a graphic which was quickly followed by a second display of the committees as three clearly overlapping cir-

This emphasized the critical future task of integrating committee recommendations and assuring that they can be combined into a coherent whole.

With the subcommittees' march-

ing orders in place, the planning staff then demonstrated its new "Community VIZ" software. The software can graphically display the impact of, for example, a projected change in population on schools enrollment and water supply needs. It is expected to allow the committee to visualize the impact of any land-use recommendations it may consider.


Paul Hodges, the committee's Vice-Chairman, then outlined the schedule for completing the process of developing and approving the Area A plan.

The meeting concluded with a

slide show of photographs of Area A, taken by steering committee members, highlighting points of interest such as landscape, historic buildings, things to preserve, and things to change.




