Truck parking still a hot topic

Overnight parking of big trucks in Seven Lakes North and South came back off the table during the Wednesday, June 27 General Meeting of the Seven Lakes Landowners Association [SLLA], and the resulting discussion left

one trucker vowing to quit the community for good.

Steve Younger, an over-the road driver, who said he brings his

truck — without its trailer — to his home at most once a month, left the meeting after telling Board members that he would be putting his home on the market. "My house is going on the market. We're moving out of here," Younger said, as Board members debated a motion from Treas-

urer Steve Hudson to ban overnight parking of big trucks. Several landowners in attendance called out "No!" as Younger and his wife left the meeting.

Earlier in the meeting, Younger, who presented the Board with letters of support from a number of his neighbors, said "We came

here to retire with you folks. We want to be neighbors." Younger said eighteen residents of homes near his had signed a petition in support of allowing him to bring his truck to his home on a limited basis.

Board approves new Northside pool fence

While overnight truck parking was the hot issue on the agenda for the Seven Lakes Landowners Association Wednesday, June 27 General Meeting, the lengthy meeting covered a wide range of other business.

Northside Pool. The Board of Directors unanimously approved the installation of a new fence around the Northside pool. Existing wooden panels will be replaced with a six-foot tall aluminum product that has the appearance of wrought iron. The total cost is expected to be less than \$25,000; the job can be completed without closing the pool.

A proposal to provide food service from the North Clubhouse kitchen during hours when the pool is open has apparently died, Recreation Director Laura Douglass reported. The vendor who had made the proposal failed to respond to a board counterproposal.

Boating rules. New boating rules proposed by the Lakes and Dams Committee occasioned a lengthy discussion among Board members, most of which focused on how to deal with an amphibious craft — able to travel on land or water — owned by a Northside landown-

Both discussions appeared to try the patience of some members of the Lakes and Dams Committee. "You're nit-picking," committee member George Stahl told the Board. "We tried to do it right and now you are picking it apart."

Committee member Ron Ersk-

ine noted that a shortened version of the new rules had been printed and was already being distributed in advance of the

July 4th holiday.

Apparently persuaded by Erskine's point, the Board unanimously approved the new rules, with the proviso that the minor points they had debated would be finalized via email exchanges

among Board members.

Buoys. Boating also figured in a board discussion about whether to purchase white or orange buoys needed to more clearly outline the ski area on Lake Sequoia. The Lakes and Dams Committee recommended more expensive white buoys, because of a concern expressed by some sailors that orange buoys are hard to distinguish from the large orange temporary buoys used to mark the course for sailboat races

Some residents expressed concern that the orange buoys are less attractive, while others argued that the white ones are harder to see. Ultimately the board moved in the direction of economy and voted to purchase the less expensive orange buoys.

Detached garages. Director

Nuti told his fellow board members that he had found an apparent contradiction between a rule forbidding detached garages promulgated by the Architectural Review Board [ARB] and a clear statement in both North and Southside covenants allowing detached garages.

ARB Director Donna Stephan said she had spoken with her counterparts in Seven Lakes West and Pinewild and found general agreement that rules and regulations could be adopted that are stricter than the covenants. She warned Nuti against "nit-picking this thing to death." After considerable discussion, the board moved on to other matters without taking any action.

amphibian as a boat and allowing its use on the lakes.

Current SLLA rules prohibit All-Terrain Vehicles [ATVs], and Director Ed Nuti, who chairs the Rules and Regulations Com-

er. The Lakes and Dams Com-

mittee proposed classifying the

Rules and Regulations Committee, felt that prohibition would apply to the amphibious craft as well. Though Nuti did not argue against allowing the amphibian, he expressed concern about creating an internal contradiction in the rules.

There was also a good bit of discussion about language proposed by the Lakes and Dams Committee requiring boats pulling a skier to stay at least 75 feet from shorelines and piers. SLLA President Don Truesdell noted that this language seemed to conflict with the existing placement of ski area buoys on Lake Sequoia, which are 150 feet from shore.



New pumps are in, but the jury's still out

The pumps that supply Seven Lakes' water have been upgraded, but it's too early yet to tell whether they will deliver the extra 140,000 gallons a day that Moore County Public Utilities is hoping for.

"We're still gathering data," Utility Operations Manager Ben Vaughn told *The Times* on Tuesday, July 3, "I want to see how it is going to run over a week or two."

The bulk of Seven Lakes water is piped in from the county-owned system which serves Pinehurst. The source includes wells in Pinehurst and water purchased from Southern Pines. The line that connects Pinehurst and Seven Lakes was recently upgraded, and a com-

pletely new pump station is in the works for the Spring of next year. So the just-completed pump upgrade is something of a stopgap, aimed at getting Seven Lakes through the Summer dry season.

With the help of occasional rainfall, Seven Lakes water conservation efforts over the past week have held usage close to the 577,000 gallon per day goal the county has asked for by imposing Stage 2 Water Conservation measures (See the graph at right.)

Public Utilities recorded 1.2 inches of rainfall in Seven Lakes from Wednesday, June 27 to Tuesday, July 3, but Vaughn cautions that the County is still in a rainfall deficit for the year.




Seven Lakes Water Usage

Upgrade coming for Seven Lakes Food Lion

Food Lion in Seven Lakes will undergo a major renovation this Summer. Construction, scheduled to begin on Monday, July 9, will continue to an estimated completion date in early October. The store will get new paint, new colors, new tile, and new lighting.

New product offerings are also in the works: expanded fresh meat, deli, and produce departments to include organic and natural foods and products, both fresh and frozen.

"The look of Food Lion is changing," said Store Manager Joe Callihan, "but not the prices. This is our way of giving back to the community — to reinvest and make our store nicer."

Food Lion will remain open for business throughout the renewal process; however, occasional department closings will occur. In particular, said Callihan, the deli department will undergo major reconstruction requiring a dust wall to be erected which will close this department for a couple of weeks in August.


Founded in 1957 as Food Town in Salisbury, North Carolina, Food Lion is one of the nation's largest grocery chains with over 1,200 stores in eleven Southeastern and Mid-Atlantic states. Food Lion has an employee base of 73,000 and serves 10 million customers each week.

According to Callihan, Food Lion initiated the renewal process in 2004. Though some older, individual outlets are selected for updating, the improvements to the Seven Lakes store are part of a larger upgrade for the Sandhills. The three Food Lion stores in Pinehurst and Aberdeen will also be updated.

Other high-profile markets that have already undergone renewal are Myrtle Beach, Raleigh, and Charlotte.

"Once construction is complete, a grand reopening celebration will be held," said Calli-

School Board gives Dr. Purser high marks

It was all gold stars for Moore County Schools Superintendent Susan Purser, whose performance over the past year was recently reviewed by the Board of Education.

Purser received particularly high marks from the Board for her work in forging an amicable and productive relationship with the County Commissioners. Both Boards worked closely together to achieve a budget which provides for implementation of new academic programs to benefit Moore County students, as well as meeting new federal and state mandates.

Board members were unanimous in their praise of this year's budget process, led by Dr. Purser, and pleased with the focus on direct benefit to students. Her work toward achieving Phase One of the Facilities Master Plan was also a high point of the year. The first phase of the plan, which includes a new elementary school in the Pinehurst-West End area, a new middle school in the Vass-Cameron area, and improvements at various schools around the county, will be placed before the voters in a bond referendum in the fall.

"Dr. Purser is committed to the students of Moore County and is working hard to lead a successful bond campaign in the fall," said Board Vice-Chairman Dr. Lorna Clack.

The Board also appreciated Purser's emphasis on treating all schools in the county equitably and making decisions about the allocation of resources among schools based on needs rather than numbers.

Purser's management philosophy includes reaching out to the community and school employees to gather input on issues facing schools. She has done this through a variety of means, including hosting "Superintendent's Evening Chats" open to the public, personally conducting meetings for input from the public and employees on the school district calendar and budget, initiating an extensive public input process for facility planning, and holding regular monthly meetings with groups representing teachers, classified personnel, and students.

Initiatives under her leadership include a twelve-year Facilities Master Plan and the organization of task forces to study alternative program, reading, high schools, and athletics.

She maintains an "open door" policy for anyone who wishes to speak with her, and has been a guest speaker at many civic clubs, as well as several churches and other organizations.

Purser serves on the Moore County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, was formerly a member of the United Way Board of Directors, the Ruth Pauley Lecture Series Board of Directors, the Boys and Girls Club Board of Directors, the First Health Board and the Moore County Public Education Foundation. She is also a founding member of Moore Friends for Mississippi, a group who coordinated the "adoption" by Moore County of a town in Mississippi following Hurricane Katrina. She serves as the vice-chairman of the Sandhills Region Education Consortium, and, at the state level, she serves on the State Superintendents' Advisory Council and as the Chairperson for the N.C. State Textbook Commis-

On a national level, Dr. Purser is a member of the Horace Mann League Board of Directors and the Junior Achievement Worldwide Educators' Advisory Council. She was also named an Outstanding Communicator in 2005 by the National School Public Relations Association and was selected by Pinehurst Magazine as one of the Sandhills' Ten Most Influential People and featured in the magazine's January -February 2005 issue.

Dr. Purser has an undergraduate degree in mathematics from Millsaps College in Mississippi and a Master's Degree in mathematics and Education Specialist's degree in secondary education from Mississippi State University. She earned her Doctorate in Education Leadership with a minor in research from the University of Southern Mississippi.

She began her career in 1971 as a math teacher in Jackson, Mississippi, where she remained until 1988 other than a two-year stint teaching math at Mississippi State University. During that time, she served as teacher, principal, curriculum specialist,

and director of special projects. She then spent four years in Oklahoma City as a divisional director of planning, research, and information services.

From 1992 to 1996, she was assistant superintendent in Newport News, Virginia, moving to

Charlotte, as associate superintendent from 1996-1999. While in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg school system, she oversaw curriculum, accountability, exceptional children, staff development, technology, student assignment, and public relations

In January, 2000, Dr. Purser began her tenure as superintendent of Pontotoc City Schools in Pontotoc, Mississippi, where she remained until assuming the superintendent's position for

that each of the vehicles was traveling at approximately 45 miles per hour. In the space provided for listing traffic violations, Simmons wrote "pending."

Both Horney and Chambers were transferred to UNC Medical Center in Chapel Hill via life-flight helicopter.

What's that thing in the water, Mommy?

Over the past year and a half, and with the help of Dr. Patricia Sellers, a lake ecologist at UNC-

Pembroke, I have been looking at the tiny, mostly invisible, creatures that inhabit the water of Lake Auman. They are part of what is called lake plankton —


the group of microscopic organisms suspended in the water. Plankton are not attached to anything and have limited or no motility.

I have prepared brief descriptions with photos of what we have found. Even the best pictures would loose too much detail if printed in the Seven Lakes West newsletter or The Seven Lakes Times.

So, as the work progresses, I am adding segments to our website, and will let you know as new galleries appear. To see what we have found so far, go to our website http://sevenlakeswest.org/ and look under Lake Auman Information. Then

click on plankton.

Some of these are as beautiful and intricate as works of art and others are as strange as aliens from outer space. Since these are native to our local waters, they are probably in all the lakes around here, not just Lake Auman.

Ticks: Not your Momma's favorite arthropod

Second only to mosquitoes, ticks are among the leading carriers of diseases to humans in the United States. Tick's saliva contains toxins that they transmit through the bite that cause disease. With more than 800 species throughout the world, ticks are responsible for carrying such diseases as Rocky Mountain spotted fever, Lyme disease, Tularemia, and many others.

Ticks normally hang out in low brush or grassy areas waiting for a host to feast upon. The

about the tick is the toxin it releases into your skin upon biting you disallows you to feel the bite and therefore usually the suspect is completely unaware of its attachment.

I've had multiple queries concerning ticks and tick bites so far this Spring and I wanted to write an article detailing what I've learned about these cumbersome arthropods. Insofar as symptoms as concerned, as I mentioned earlier, most often a person will not feel the bite itself and therefore localized pain is rare. A victim of a tick bite may experience these symptoms; flulike symptoms, fever, numbness, rash, confusion, weakness, pain and swelling of the joints, palpitations, nausea and vomiting. So the question becomes "when do I see a doctor?" According to my research, a doctor should be seen if the person bitten exhibits weakness, confusion,

fever, numbness, headache or rash. A doctor should also be seen if the person bitten is unable to remove the tick or any significant amount of the head or mouthparts from the skin. Remember, ticks are second only to mosquitoes in carrying disease to humans.

Caution and careful attention should be exercised when removing a tick. Although this process may seem intuitive, it is important to use the proper technique to avoid leaving behind any of the tick's body parts in the skin. The first step is to use a small pair of

tweezers and if possible, wear gloves so as not to transfer any of the bacteria from the tick to your hands. Using the tweezers, grasp the tick

as close to the skin as possible and gently pull until the tick comes free. Flush the tick down the toilet or sink drain; do not crush it as this will spread bacteria. The next step is to check the bite area to be sure the head and mouthparts are fully removed. Thoroughly rinse the bite area with soap and water or a mild disinfectant. And also wash hands! It is important to observe the area for several days for the development of any reactions. Again, if any of the symptoms mentioned above occur, visit your doctor for treat-

The best way to combat a tick bite is to prevent it. Avoid grassy areas and shrubs where ticks hide. Wear light colored clothing so ticks are more easily spotted. Tuck your pants into your boots or socks. Apply insect repellant, specifically the brands designed to repel ticks. If grassy

areas are unavoidable be sure to check yourself thoroughly after exposure.

To summarize, Spring, Summer and Fall are great seasons to be outdoors but the game plan is to exercise some minor precautions along the way. If you are outdoors, take the proper precautions to prevent tick bites and check yourself after exposure to grassy or wooded areas. If you do get bitten, remove the tick properly and keep a watch on the bite area. If you experience any of the symp-

toms mentioned earlier contact your doctor. These are a few easy steps to handling Tick season.



Board should never have allowed truck parking

Dear Editor:

There are approximately 1,200 of us who, when we moved into the community of Seven Lakes North or South, were given a Property Owners Manual containing our covenants and rules and regulations. Those of us who read them doubtless took note of Chapter V. Section E, which states in full:

"No commercial vehicle used in conjunction with the Owner's office, studio, or other business may be parked on an Owner's lot or on a road or right of way at such lot, except for loading and unloading or other temporary needs. The commercial classi-

fication includes construction vehicles or machinery, trailers, vans and trucks larger than three quarter ton capacity".

At the time this paragraph was adopted it seemed to cover every possibility. No one even dreamt of the possible introduction of tractors and/or their trailers

Not long ago, however, a recent board introduced two paragraphs into an entirely different section of this manual, (Chapter II subsection J) which in effect contradicted the above. They approved a rule allowing tractors entry into Seven Lakes and permitting them to be parked in your neighbor's driveway or mine, for as many as four days each month. This new regulation would

never have been adopted had it been well publicized and had the public been given an opportunity to express its opinion. You now have that opportunity.

The new rule was introduced solely for the benefit of three or four tractor owner-operators without any consideration being given their immediate neighbors, or without any public discussion. Nor was any thought

given to its probable and. believe. inevitable effect on community standards or property values. Quite simply, it was adopted in haste.

The subject of tractors has now been debated by the board "ad nauseam". Let's put it to rest. The board has far more important issues confronting it than tractors, the definition of boats vs. ATVs, or the number and color of Lake Sequoia's buoys. What should have taken ten minutes this past Wednesday took well

over an hour and little was decid-

The board should simply delete Chapter II, sub-section J, from the Owner's Manual, and add the word "tractors" to Chapter V Section E. This simple change will, in effect, exclude them from the community. The board should do so at their next work session on July 11. A motion to this effect and a subsequent vote would take all of ten minutes.

a letter from Southsider Dave Kinney urgining the SLLA Board to ban the parking of big trucks in Seven Lakes. SLLA President Don Truesdell read the letter during the June 27 General Meeting of the Association.]

To:Don Truesdell, President, SLLA From: Dave Kinney RE: Parking Tractor-Trailers in Seven Lakes

First, we want to make it perfectly clear that we are not against truckers.

We are against permitting any Association member (property owner or renter) who owns or leases a tractor-trailer to have his or her rig (or part of it) parked within Seven Lakes (North or South) at any time.

Many residents - particularly those who made Seven Lakes their home say more than ten years ago — never expected to see tractor-trailers parked within the community.

The fact that the issue is not covered in any governing document is not surprising. Most likely, the writers of the original documents never conceived it would ever be an issue — they

[The following is the full text of never even thought of it. Through the years as the By-Laws and Rules and Regulations were being updated, no one anticipated it was or would ever become an issue.

> The By-Laws and Rules and Regulations exist for two fundamental reasons — to protect our property values and our quality of life. Initially, my and many others' perception would have been that the presence of tractor-trailers harms property values. Realtors have confirmed it is not perception, it is reality.

While we believe open discussion on the issue is necessary and desireable, quick action by the board will keep it "within the gates" and reduce the opportunity for the media to exploit the issue, fanning any devisive flames.



- Moving the front entrance gate further down Lakeway Drive in order to provide a more attractive gateway to the community.
- Expanding the beach at Johnson Point.
- · Increasing the number of boat moorings in the community.
- · Manning the east gate.
- · Making the septic management system mandatory
- Exploring ways to adequately fund the SLWLA capital reserve accounts.
- Using MS Project as a platform for organizing, communicating, and tracking the community's long-range plan.
- Exploring a reverse 9-1-1 system for getting emergency information out the the community.
- Considering a warning siren for storm-related emergencies.

Among the milestones the committee has set for itself are having an integrated long-range plan in place by December, providing monthly progress reports to the Board, having a community data system in place by Fall, having a plan for a walking trail in place by Summer's End, and redesigning SLWLA registration forms by next Spring.

Mail delivery. Supplementing

Jenner's overview of the work of the LRP committee, Gus Danielson provided a brief update on progress toward home mail delivery for the West Side. Danielson said the US Postal Service [USPS], at the local and regional level had offered little hope that home delivery could be implemented, citing a policy that there will be no change in the mode of delivery unless that change is economically advantageous to the USPS.

Yet continuing to rely on mailhouse delivery could be expensive for the SLWLA, Danielson said. Building the three central mailhouses that the Postal Service says are necessary to serve the West Side could cost \$635,000.

Danielson spearheaded a drive to involve political leaders, including US Senator Elizabeth Dole and Congressman Howard Coble, in changing the Postal Service's mind. Neither effort has borne fruit, Danielson reported. The LRP Committee will be considering its next steps.

Walking-Biking trail. New LRP Committee member Sherry Niewald reported on her efforts to plan and raise funds for the construction of walking and biking trails that will help connect the neighborhoods within the West Side. She said her subcommittee hopes to raise \$1,700 for the construction of the first trail segment and will also be developing a plan for funding and constructing a community-wide trail network. [See the June 22 edition of The Times, page 8, for more information on Niewald's efforts.]

Area Reps. Secretary Ed Tuton said he had "been charged with reorganizing the Area Representative network and has divided the West Side into 39 Area Rep districts. There are already 31 volunteers to represent those areas: additional reps are sought for the others

Detailed information about the areas in which volunteers are needed — as well as a list of current Area Reps was published in the May edition of the SLWLA Community Newsletter; copies are available at the Community Center and on the SLWLA Web-

Organizational meettings for the area reps are schedule for Wednesday, July 11 at 10:00 am and 7:00 pm, as well as Thursday, July 12 at 7:00 pm, to make sure that all reps have current copies of the community handbook and explore the possibility of establishing a "telephone tree" that can help get information out to residents quick-

"The target date to complete the reorganization process is by early September," Tuton said. "From that point on, we will have every-other-month meetings where they can bring concerns that arise from the areas they represent."

President's report. SLWLA President Jim Haggard opened the meeting with the announcement that an anonymous donor, impressed with the beautification work that Ronnie and Betty Milligan and the Beautification Committee had done on Lakeway Drive and Johnson Point, had made a sizable donation toward future beautification efforts.

Haggard said the Board had


approved a reformatted and more user friendly fee schedule for 2007, which is available on the website or at the SLWLA office.



concern about an issue, go to The Seven Lakes Times website," Haggard said. Referring to the Times Forum section of the website, he added, "you can put concerns out there and get responses."

Haggard reported that he had asked the Personnel Committee, chaired by Ron Sickenberger, to look at the pros and cons of the SLWLA having its own employees versus using a community management company — or a combination of both. Other members of that committee include Nancy Workman and Lois Rocco, as well as Haggard and Community Manager Tony Robertson as non-voting members.

Manager's Report. Community Manager Tony Robertson said the Westside pool will be open until 9:00 pm on weeknights through the month of July on a trial basis. "If there's enough interest, there's a strong possibility it will continue to be open late through August," Robertson said. "If we find out not used between 7:00 and 9:00, we won't continue after July 31."

"Thanks all of you who have done your best to conserve water," Robertson said. Calling the situation "very, very serious," he reminded residents that Seven Lakes is still under Phase 2 Mandatory Water Conservation.

Recreation. Director Jo Nicholas provided a handout on upcoming recreation activites and highlighted swimming lessons that will begin on July 10. Classes will be offered for beginners, as well as intermediate and advanced swimmers. Full information on the lessons is available from the SLWLA office and on the website.

Security. Director Blaine Rowland said a recent session of speed enforcement by Moore County Sheriff's Department officers had measured the speed of 121 vehicles and resulted in 10 speeding citations. The highest speed was 38 miles per hour, which Rowland said "beats some of the speeds we had before."

Rowland said the installation of the new back gate entry system was scheduled to begin the next day, one Wednesday, June 27, but would not begin until the vendor had posted a performance bond.

Answering critics of the decision to rely on barcodes rather than the current electronic transponders, Rowland noted that barcodes are successfully used in in many communities — and at the gates of many military bases.

He said he had heard concerns that the barcodes could be duplicated. "That is not true," Roland said. "I have satisfied myself that you cannot do that. I do not have a concern about

Rowland noted that the Seven

Lakes Landowners Association had experienced some problems with the barcode system at the North Gate during its "shakedown" period, but has not had problems since. Continuing problems at the South Gate are not the fault of the barcode system itself but rather related to a long cable run from the South gate to the North guardhouse, he said.

Rowland noted that the board is still working on determining exactly who will be allowed to purchase barcodes. He said he would prefer they be issued exclusively to landowners and not offered to contractors who are not SLWLA members.

Environment. Director Mary Anne Fewkes thanked Ron Shepherd and Ron Workman for installing new boat tie-ups on Pine Knoll Island and at Johnson Point

Fewkes said she has identified some volunteers who will work on repairing the swim float at Johnson Point.

Public Comment. Jan Patton asked about the status of a walking trail that was to be installed as part of the West Side Park project. Tony Robertson said tree-clearing has been started and that the project is still

on the agenda.

Barbara Lewis encouraged the Board to implement both notification and enforcement activities to try to prevent the private use of fireworks on the Independence Day Holiday.

A resident who identified herself as a mother of three and a newcomer to the community said the Board needs to find better ways to communicate with younger families in the community. She said that she had difficulty, when she moved to the community, getting information about schools, bus stops, and day care centers. "No one could give me information from a parent's point of view," she said.



discussed during the SLLA Board's June 13 work session and tabled until Director Ed Nuti's rules committee could make a comprehensive presentation of rules changes near Summer's end. But the item reappeared on the agenda published for the July 27 General Meeting.

SLLA President Don Truesdell started the discussion by reading a letter from Dave Kinney of Seven Lakes South who said he was not against truckers but was against the parking of rigs inside the gates. Kinney said the original authors of Seven Lakes Rules and Regualtions never envisioned the possibility of big trucks being parked at homes in the community.

Noting that both The Times and one or more local radio stations had picked up the story, Kinney urged "quick action by the board" to keep it "within the gates and reduce the opportunity for the media to exploit the issue, fanning the flames." [See page 23 for the complete text of Kinney's letter.1

Nuti urged the Baord to stick with the plan of reviewing all proposed rule changes as a package, but Hudson made a motion to ban tractors or tractor trailers in Seven Lakes.

"Our community standards have been allowed to slide down hill," Hudson said. He said one tractor trailer owner had changed out the fuel tanks on his rig in his front yard. Another, reacting to some enforcement action from the Community Standards Committee, had lined up all his vehicles and yard equipment across the front of his property.

Director Michael Florence seconded Hudson's motion.

Nuti offered a substitute motion to delay the vote until his committee's work was done. It was during the wrangling about whose motion should be taken up first that Younger declared his intention to leave the community.

Truesdell then polled Board members on the issue. Randy Zielsdorf said he was "not real

comfortable going down the path of excluding anybody" from Seven Lakes, wondering whether motorcycles would be the next target. He said he felt allowing an owneroperator to bring in his tractor for no more than 24 hours was acceptable.

Nuti suggested that trucks should be treated in the same manner as RVs, which residents may park at their homes for no more than 48 hours for loading and unloading.

Vice President Donna Stephen suggested that a fear of "discriminating" against one group or another was a red herring. "The constitution of the United States discriminates," she said. "We are always discriminating. We are doing so to make the a better place for all of us. Our rules and regulations were written to make this a better place to live."

Florence recounted his experience with "a similar problem" in a neighborhood in an Atlanta suburb. As standards slid, property values dropped, Florence said, even though the neighborhood was located in one of the fastest growing counties in the

Director Laura Douglass said she agreed with Dave Kinney's letter and also with Stephan's contention that the purpose of community rules is to protect property values. "But I don't see why we can't make an accommodation for these two families," she said, referring to the two tractor-trailer operators thought to be living in the community at present.

When time came for public comment on the issue, Phil Thingstad said, "These are the kinds of neighbors that we really want around here — at least I do," referring to the Youngers. He disputed Florence's contention that the occasional overnight parking of a truck would hurt property values.

"You want bad publicity?" Thingstad asked. "I'm retired. I've got nothing to do. I'll write every paper in the country about this."

"I don't think anyone in here is against you or truckers," Bill Yarrish said. "It does affect real estate values . . . a Realtor® is not going to be pleased about it." He advocated grandfathering existing truckers if a ban were imposed.

Ron Erskine said that his informal email poll of 27 people had found almost all favored a ban.

After listening to the other comments, Charlie Oliver said, "I sense the community feels these existing trucks should be grandfathered, but doesn't want more of them. I would suggest you consider grandfathering."

Ultimately, Truesdell wrested from Nuti a commitment to make a presentation on a proposed rules change on the issue at the July 11 Board Work Session. Nuti modified his motion to reflect that compromise and it passed six to one with only Hudson opposed.

That motion being dispensed with, the Board took up Hudson's original motion to ban the trucks, though the point seemed to be moot. That motion failed in a four-to-three vote, with Hudson, Florence, and Truesdell in favor.

Michael Florence reported that the tires on Roving Patrol Officer Carolyn Tuner's vehicle had been slashed while it was parked near the North gate. It cost the SLLA over \$400 to replace the tires and a \$500 reward is being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the party or parties responsible.

Florence said he would like to initiate a policy in which vehicles left parked unattended on Association property would be towed. The parking lot at Big Juniper Lake "has become a leave-off place for cars," he said. President Truesdell said provision of the Planned Community Act might require a warning before a vehicle can be towed. Resident Bill Yarrish suggested establishing limiting parking on SLLA property to a certain number of hours, rather than simply towing any unattended vehicle, as Florence appeared to suggest.

Recreation. Director Douglass said she is considering asking for a change in the rules and regulations that would lift the minimum age at which children may use the pool unescorted by an adult. Currently, children over the age of nine may come to the pool alone; Douglass suggested raising that to twelve years of age.

Douglass reported that Summer Camp is attracting an average of twenty-four children each day, twelve of whom are staying for the afternoon session.

Thirty folks are regularly participating in water aerobics. Swim classes are already over, but

private swim lessons can be arranged through the Landowners Office. Pool hours are Noon 'til 6:00 pm; Friday and Saturday until 8:00 pm. Douglass noted that the Westside Pool will be open until 9:00 pm during the month of July on a trial basis.

Assistant Community Manager Chad Beane noted that seventy children have signed up to participate in the Seven Lakes Stingrays swim team. He encouraged residents to attend the meets that will be held at the Northside pool

All the summer horse camps are full, she said, noting that the fee may be raised to \$25 next year, and that it may be possible to increase the number of campers served by enrolling two children per horse, with campers rotating day-by-day between riding and stable education.

A new fence will be added to the pasture this fall, and the pasture will be seeded with rye, so that the stable staff can practice pasture rotation and incorporate more fresh grass into the diet of the horses.

Noting that some residents along the trail ride route have complained of ruts caused by the horses along the front of their property, Douglass said horses could be kept off the streets if the ten-foot wide buffer that rings the entire community were not overgrown in places. She and Chad Beane will be surveying the buffer strip behind Ramapo in order to identify trees and shrubs that can be selectively eliminated in order to allow the

trail riders to use the buffer.

Douglass said she hopes to "engage the younger population" in Seven Lakes as a way of directing their energies into positive activities rather than petty vandalism and other undesirable pursuits. Her first attempt will be a skateboarding demonstration and workshop featuring William Dean, President of Skaters for Moore. This will create an opporunity to open a discussion with Seven Lakes skateboarders about community rules that impact their sport.

Douglass said she would like to explore adding a low brick wall to the basketball court, which would provide a place for players to sit, as well as some structure for skateboarders to utilize.

ARB. Director Stephan said her committee had reviewed three homes at its last meeting,

approving one, approving one with conditions, and denying the third. Five alterations and additions were approved, one was conditionally approved, and one was sent back for more information.

Community Standards. Director Randy Zielsdorf said that six community standards complaints were in the process of being resolved, one of which may go to the judicial committee. He said he had received a number of complaints about unlicensed miniature motorcycles being ridden in the community. The Board asked Director Florence to consult with Moore County Sheriff Lane Carter about and laws applicable to the bikes.

Maintenance. Director Ed Nuti said he believes the amount of illegal dumping of yard waste by landscape contractors is on the rise and encouraged residents to remind their yard man that the SLLA debris dump is for use by residents only.

Finance. Treasurer Steve Hudson distributed a detailed yearend report on community finances, which he had also made available at the Board Work Session two weeks ago, showing total revenues of \$1,279,000 and total expenses of \$1,390,000 for a net loss of \$111,000.

Hudson said 82 resident had so far elected to make payments rather than pay their dues in a single lump sum. Forty-four have chosen to pay monthly; 23, quarterly, and 15, semi-annually. Those electing this option are charged the equivalent of twelve percent annual interest on their unpaid dues and are charged a \$20 late fee if they are late in making payments.



This Association must incorporate more efficient methods for generating and handling member information. That is one of the primary reasons we need to make improvements to the Association's automated databases. Why do I bring this issue up now?

I spent about a month on June 20th, 21st and 22nd (well...it seemed like a month!) at West Park with nine other volunteers evaluating and entering some 1,515 vehicle registrations into a computer (total time: approximately 123 hours). This was information returned to the Association from the May registration package. The staff is still working on entry of another 1000 registrations and more are continuing to trickle in.

Two other teams have been involved in documenting and entering boat registrations and member dues information. Mary Anne Fewkes and another nine volunteers and staff spent 55 hours evaluating and entering boat registration data. The Association staff has taken care of dues information. Again, boat and dues data is still coming in

The Association asks members, year in and year out, to fill out blank forms and send them in. This mountain of paperwork is collected and we expect the Association's staff to take all this data and do something significant with it.

Before I lose you completely, let me get to two points:

- 1. It is impossible for the Association's staff to handle all this data and still perform the other functions the community expects of them.
- 2. The Association wastes money every year by continuing a registration process that receives valuable member data, but, because the job of evaluation and data entry is so huge, member information tends to sit, unused, because it's simply too hard to get at the data.

The solution to this problem is:

- build a database application that is capable of generating preprinted membership forms;
- place the data collected this year into that database application;
- print 2008 registration forms that contain all the dues, vehicle and boat information for each Association member;
- send these tailored forms to the membership in April/May of 2008; and
- Ask members to make corrections and return the corrected forms to the Association.

This process will dramatically reduce the manpower requirements necessary to maintain member information and enable the Association's staff to better track member data.

Participating in this year's vehicle registration process has been a rather enlightening experience. I can also say, without reservation, that unless changes are made to the registration process, I won't go through the experience again! As a matter of fact, if we don't have a database that pre-prints member information on registration forms for 2008...just take me out "behind the barn" and shoot me...cause 2007 will have been a total failure.

Fences

Occasionally, questions arise regarding the installation of a fence. Fences have been permitted in Seven Lakes West since the original covenants were established in 1979. Fences may be approved if (1) there is documentation which explains the purpose of the fence, (2) it meets the established criteria for style as mentioned in the Standards for Design and Construction, (3) there is documentation that owners of adjacent property have been notified and (4) the location of the fence is shown on a plan of the lot which depicts the setbacks from the property line and also the vegetation used for screening.

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

SLWLA members living in the vicinity of new house construction, renovations or additions should be alert to non-compliance actions or breaches of the legal documents of the Association by persons associated with construction activities. Special attention should be paid to tree removal and improper drainage and erosion control. If there is concern as to a questionable practice or activity, contact the SLWLA manager.

DAM/SPEED BUMPS

Speeding over the dam has caused damage to the dam. Speed bumps at both ends of the dam were installed at the recommendation of Dan Marks (our dam engineer) With the speed bumps, it will be critical that

local traffic observe the speed restrictions.

The dam is made of earthen materials, so a small amount of water naturally seeps through the dam. This is expected and considered normal. This seepage is monitored by peizometers, the toe drain and two lateral drains. Peizometer read-ings are taken at regular intervals (currently 4 times a year), analyzed by our engineer, and incorporated into the annual report. We send this report to the state before they do their annual inspection.

Rainfall on the backside of the dam infiltrates the soil as ground water. This, together with water moving through the dam seeps out onto the surface behind the dam. Areas of high seepage are observed as wet marshy areas. Water that accumulates in these seeps is collected by an underground drainpipe through metal drain grates at the surface, which look like 2-foot high pyramids with holes in them. There is a wet spot behind the dam, which we were planning to repair in 2008. However, after consulting with Dan Marks, we have decided to repair that section in 2007.

Long Range Planning George Jenner

The Long Range Planning Committee continues our search for help from residents to provide assistance in the planning and formulation of a new community database system. This system will effectively consolidate the current smaller databases now in existence and add features which are both needed and desired for the community as we move forward and mature.

This new Community data base will use MS Access as its core. We need people who are knowledgeable in moving data between Access and Excel and people who can revise data in Excel to meet format requirements of Access.
