# Commissioners will hear NCDOT on crossing project

A concerted effort by the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association [SLWLA] to put the Seven Lakes-West End railroad crossing project back on track appears to have borne fruit.

North Carolina Department of Transportation [NCDOT] officials have been invited to a Thursday, January 15 Work Session of the Moore County Board of Commissioners to provide a briefing on and answer questions about the railway corridor safety project.

The project would upgrade

the Lakeway Drive crossing at the front entrance to Seven Lakes West, as well as the crossing at NC Highway 73 and NC Highway 211 near West End Fire and Rescue, while closing crossings at Mode Road and Edgewood Terrace.

After learning in early December that the support of the Board of Commissioners was critical to state approval for the crossing project, the SLWLA Board of Directors mailed a letter on December 10 to the Association's entire membership asking them to contact both NCDOT and the five Moore County Com-

missioners to express support for the project.

"You are their constituents and voters/tax payers in Moore County," the letter, signed by President Mary Anne Fewkes,

"[NCDOT's] proposal will not be implemented unless the public expresses sufficient support of it to override the concerns expressed to the County Commissioners by those who may be adversely affected. Please help us make our case!"

NCDOT Project Engineer Nancy Horne told *The Times* on

## **Postal Customers donate** 3,000 lbs to Food Pantry

Three area post offices col- Nancy Boroughs at Jackson lected more than 3,000 pounds of food for the Food Pantry at West End United Methodist Church in a drive organized by West End Postmaster Harold Jones.

After learning from Dr. Won Namkoong, Pastor at WEUMC, that the pantry was running short of food, Jones enlisted the help of his fellow postmasters, Jayne Cagle in Eagle Springs and

Springs. Drop boxes were placed at the post offices and at the mail houses in Seven Lakes. and rural customers were asked to donate through their carriers.

The result was 3,370 pounds of food collected for the pantry. West End customers donated 1,850 pounds; Jackson Springs, 850, and Eagle Springs, 607.

The West End Food Pantry is open every other Wednesday and provides each needy family with a box of assorted foodstuffs - two boxes if it's a big family.

'We're not trying to feed people for two weeks with that," Frank Feggeler, Food Bank coordinator, told The Times, "It's just a supplement."

Over the past couple of months, the Food Bank has served nearly 250 families each time it has been open -269 were served during the Thanksgiving distribution.

The organization was found-

ed in 1992 with the support of the United Methodist Men and the Salvation Army. It is now a major mission of the West End congregation and receives regular support from Roseland United Methodist Church and the Seven Lakes Kiwanis, among others.

The Food Pantry has traditionally purchased much of the food it distributes from the Sandhills Food Bank, which is in turn part of the regional Food Bank of Eastern and Central North Carolina. The cost of food purchased from this source is only eighteen cents per pound, but the Food Banks have increasingly had trouble keeping their warehouses stocked — leaving Feggeler and the other Food Pantry workers scrambling to find food to distribute.

Feggeler is a close reader of grocery store sales circulars and buys in bulk whenever he finds a great deal on staple items.

## First it was geese, now beavers, what's next?

Standing upright but suffering from deep notches in the trunk, Dave Jolliffe's apple tree was clearly under attack — from beavers, he'd soon learn.

"It's been fascinating to learn more about beavers but it made me angry that they took that pretty tree," said Jolliffe.

Gnawing a little bit more each night, it took only days for the furry

critters to fell the twelve-year old tree. Residents of Seven Lakes West since 1995, Dave and his wife Joan said this is their first experience with beavers in Lake Auman.

Primarily nocturnal animals, beavers subsist chiefly on bark, twigs, and the roots of water plants, and are related to the squirrel family. They do not hibernate, instead storing sticks and logs underwater to feed on during the winter. Reaching seventy-five to ninety pounds, beavers can be somewhat intimidating because they are generally not afraid of people.

When frightened, they will forcefully slap the water with their broad tail, warning other beavers in the area, before submerging for a lengthy period. Slow on land, beavers are very good swimmers and can stay underwater for up to fifteen minutes

Both destroyers and creators, beavers are considered a keystone species because they create wetlands that are used by other animals. Besides humans, biologists agree, no other creature does more to shape its land-scape.

According to the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, the beaver was trapped nearly to extinction in many sections of the United States including North Carolina. In the 1930s and 1940s, several states began restocking programs. Twenty-nine beavers were released in 1939 on what is now known as the Sandhills Game Land.

Jolliffe contacted Weymouth Woods to discuss his felled apple tree and was told that beavers are now over-populated in the Sandhills and are seeking out new habitats. They suggest that lakefront residents protect their ornamentals and fruit trees, located near the water, by girdling the tree with hardware cloth or similar wire mesh extending two to three

feet above the ground or high water level. Black or aluminum roof coating painted on tree trunks may also reduce gnawing damage by beavers.

"I just hope by telling our story we can make other people aware and help save their trees," said Jolliffe.

So far, none of his neighbor's trees have been damaged and the beavers have not returned to harvest his crape myrtles.

"I was told you can't shoot them and even if you did, there would be two more [beavers] right away," joked Jolliffe. "However, we have always enjoyed the wildlife here — seeing the deer, geese, and the ducks. But there's obviously been a lot more going on that we didn't see!"

## Village planning board reviews PUD rules

Laying groundwork for a review of the Stonehill Pines Master Plan, the Foxfire Planning Board met on Monday, December 15 and reviewed the Foxfire Village Planned Unit Development [PUD] Ordinance. Drafted in 1997, the ordinance was revised last Summer by lawyer Michael Brough, and adopted by the Village Council

The updated version is shorter, simpler, and more workable than what preceded it. Applicants may submit a request to rezone for a PUD conditional zoning district on tracts at least fifty acres in size. The PUD zoning process is intended to provide the Village an opportunity to approve large-scale, well-planned communities, to be developed under standards that allow design flexibility while still protecting and promoting the health, safety, and welfare of the Village and its extraterritorial planning jurisdiction.

Craig Ramey, chair of the Planning and Zoning Board, said the ordinance is not intended to limit the discretion of the Village Council to deny an application if it determines that the proposed rezoning is not in the public interest. Also, approval of a PUD district merely establishes the zoning for the property. Development of the property may require additional permits such as subdivision approval under the subdivision ordinance.

In addition to any other fees generally required under the ordinance, a PUD district rezoning applicant must reimburse the Village for the full amount of costs incurred by the Village to hire planning, legal, engineering, or other professional consultants to assist the Village in reviewing and evaluating the application.

With regards to Stonehill Pines, Ramey said the developer has been meeting and working with the Village-backed Quality Assurance Team, led by Tom Collins.

#### Other business

Ramey also reviewed, during the December 15 meeting, additions and revisions recommended for the Zoning Ordinance. Faced with several legal questions, the Board approved meeting with Brough for a special Work Session in mid-January.

Discussion items will include concerns over density and future growth challenges — particularly when rural lots are brought within Village corporate limits. Ramey said he wants clarification on setback distances, livestock and farm animal regulations, unpaved rural roads, and whether the existing ten-acre

nits. equine zoning ordinance should cabe revised.

ve- Brough will also be asked to ula- weigh in on a suggestion to

weigh in on a suggestion to rezone Foxfire's two golf courses and two parks as Recreational Districts to prevent major residential development.

"If approved, a Recreational District does not mean that a property owner could not request a variance in the future," said Ramey.

However, such districts, according to Ramey, will be useful in preserving valuable community assets.

The Foxfire Planning Board next regular meeting will be held Wednesday, January 21 at 7:00 pm at Town Hall.

## SLLA Board upholds Judicial Committee fines

A Judicial Committee decision to fine a boater and revoke his boating privileges until May 2009 was upheld by the full Board of Dricetors of the Seven Lakes Landowners Association [SLLA] in a closed meeting held on Thursday, December 18, at 3:00 pm.


SLLA President Randy Zielsdorf provided *The Times* with information about the Board's decision.

The Judicial Commitee found the boater guilty of violating three separate rules, including the general speed limit, the lower speed limit near shore, and operating a boat under the influence of imparing substances.

Zielsdorf said the Board overruled the Judicial Commitee on the third item because of a lack of conclusive evidence.

Violations on the other counts were upheld — as was the fine and the suspension of boating privileges.

This was the first time in memory that a decision of the Judicial Comittee has been appealed to the full board, Zielsdrof told *The Times*.



If you want a good laugh blog, go back to that New York Times front page and, just below where you clicked on 'blogs', click on 'Cartoons/Humor' Among other things, you will be able to read all of the late talk show monologs from the night before.

But blogs offer much more than that . . . almost anything and everything. Want to know how to re-wire a lamp or repair a vacuum sweeper? Go to homerepair.about.com and you will find a large array of hints and tips to fix almost anything in your house. Gardening? DiginDirt.com will lead you to almost 500 gardening blogs. Golf? Politics? Bridge? Fashion?

The easy path to all blogs is through Google. In Google, just type in what you want to read about followed by the word 'blogs.' Humor blogs, medical blogs, army blogs, scrabble blogs, Duke [NC State, Bradley, etc.] blogs, sewing blogs. You get the idea.

Some blogs are just individual personal experiences or thoughts...like reading someone's not so secret diary. There are password protected family blogs where any member anywhere can post [write] thoughts

or comments – a great way for families to stay close, club blogs, business blogs, shopping blogs. There are blogs to suit any interest. Find out yourself if blogs interest you.





## Some gardening tips for the Holiday Season

Here it is mid-December, just before Christmas and a New Year. The Winter weather has arrived and everything is pretty much on schedule.

There is very little interest in outside gardening, although if you are interested in planting shrubs, trees and some perennials, now is the time to do it. Also if you plan to redo or renovate your garden, till or spade it up when the soil moisture suitable. From now until Christmas is cleanup time for your landscapes, decorating the place, Christmas shopping, attending holiday parties, church and other activities.

Here are a few gardening suggestions or reminders that might be helpful.

· Oak tree leaves and pine straw needles have remained



on trees longer this year, but beginning to rapidly fall. Many have asked what can be done

about this delayed shedding. One suggestion you might consider, gather them up in a little used area of your property, a place that is screened from view,

> and build a mulch or compost bed. These leaves if allowed to decay and decompose will form a valuable source of

organic matter fertilizer. To aid in the composting process add small amounts of super phosphate, wood ashes, limestone, dehydrated cow manure, coffee grounds, or any other dry organic weed free material. Another suggested method of disposal is to mow-mulch them into the existing lawn.

- The best care for a live cut Christmas tree, keep it fresh and turgid by filling the tree holder with water daily. This will help the tree from drying out. Many prefer an artificial tree, but be sure it is fire resistant and UL approved as a safety measure.
- · Lights are popular during the Yuletide Season. Use only small, cool, low voltage bulbs and turn them off when you leave your home.
- · Poinsettia are popular Christmas decor. They are grown under controlled greenhouse conditions and must be acclimated to home environment conditions. Poinsettias do well in bright

areas, but not in direct sunlight. Keep them away from drafts and never place them in overheated areas, or on top of a television. Poinsettias will last longer if you keep them in a room of at least 70 degrees or a little below. Do not over water. If the plant is wrapped in foil, remove it, or punch holes in the wrapper. Cover the holes, before watering for proper drainage and aeration. Contrary to popular belief Poinsettias are not poisonous, according to medical toxicologists, although some folks may experience skin irritations from the sap.

- Mistletoe, another decorative holiday plant is poisonous. Children and pets should not be allowed to come in contact with its berries and leaves.
- · If eaten some holly and mistletoe berries could be toxic.



## Purser briefs League on No Child Left Behind

Dr. Susan Purser, the Superintendent of Moore County Public Schools, spoke to the League of Women Voters at their November meeting. Purser provided a progress report on funding received through last year's successful Education Bond, and also described the learning styles of today's students and compared teaching styles of the past versus current methods.

The Moore County Schools system has a ninety-one percent success rate under the No Child Left Behind [NCLB] goals, and average student SAT scores are above state and national levels. Moore County also out-

performed the state average on End of Grade tests. During a discussion of the No Child Left Behind program, Purser describes both its positive and negative outcomes.

NCLB is a federal program, enacted in 2001 with bipartisan support; and it requires that by 2013-2014 all students will be successful on tests in math, reading, and science. She explained that each school is broken down into subgroups [of forty or more students] by race, disability, limited English proficiency, family income, etc.

One of the negatives of the NCLB is the requirement that all of the different subgroups

have to show Adequate Yearly Progress [AYP]; even if only one group misses the goal, the whole school is listed as a failure. The reliance on one yearly exam on only one day is another negative of the procedures of NCLB. Purser stated that the harmful consequence of such an important test is that the teachers, understandingly, have excessive test preparation and curriculum reduction for the students. She said narrow curriculum, extreme test prep, and the judging of schools is harmful.

Purser stated that her core belief for good education is that learning is not just a mastery of content and being able to repeat facts, but learning is the ability to access, understand, and apply information that supports the culture and the future. The goal of Moore County School educators is to inspire excellence, not just minimum compliance. She closed by saying that she was not going to worry about Washington [standards] but to do what Moore County residents expect.

## Local Hams participate in Skywarn Day

When we are unsure about the weather we look to the TV to get a National Weather Service report. When the National Weather Service [NWS] is unsure of the weather, they look to Skywarn — hundreds of volunteers who are trained to report ground level conditions that radar cannot detect.

For 364 days of the year, volunteer Amateur Radio operators, often called "hams," affiliated with the NWS' Skywarn program provide the National Weather Service with critical, visual confirmation of major weather

But one day a year, ARRL,

the national association for Amateur Radio, and the NWS join together in recognizing all the Skywarn volunteers and light up the radio waves just for the fun

The annual Skywarn Recognition Day was held Saturday, December 6. Hams contacted National Weather Service stations throughout America.

But instead of passing tornado, snow, and ice warnings, the hams exchanged reception reports and greetings. Last year, contacts were made in all fifty states and forty countries during the twenty-four-hour event.

Amateur radio messages are able to get through to NWS offices quickly even if the phones and internet are out due to the weather. When minutes count, especially in a tornado, radio is the fastest and most certain way to get emergency messages in to the NWS offices. The value of these reports is considerable.

Skywarn volunteers are trained by NWS staff to spot and report conditions that the weather service needs to know.

Because weather radar pulses go in a straight line and cannot follow the curve of the earth, conditions from hundreds of feet above down to the ground may be missed as it is "under the radar."

Like the stagehands behind the curtain, the NWS and Skywarn hams quietly do the work that makes many local TV forecasters look good.

Many of the local Moore Coun-

ty Amateur Radio Society members are trained Skywarn spotters.



## Computer Club learns about digital TV

After February 17, 2009, all over-the-air television programming will be broadcast in digital format only. Eric Collins, Director of Government Affairs for Time Warner Cable, spoke to the Seven Lakes Computer Club on Tuesday, December 9 and explained the anticipated change.

If you have one or more televisions that receive free overthe-air televisions programming [with a roof-top antenna or "rabbit ears" on the TV] the type of TV you own is very important. A digital television, that is a TV with an internal digital turner, will allow you to continue to

watch free over-the air programming after February 17.

However, if you have an analog television, you will need a digital-to-analog converter box to continue to watch broadcast television on that set. Every U.S. household is eligible to receive up to two coupons, worth \$40 each, toward the purchase of eligible digital-to-analog converter boxes. You may request coupons by calling 1-888-388-2009 or 1-977-530-2534 or visit www.ntia.doc.gov/dtvcoupons

Cable and satellite TV subscribers with analog TVs hooked up to their cable or satellite service should not be affected by the cut-off date for full-power

analog broadcasting. Also digital cable and high definition programming on cable are not the same. Check with your cable or satellite provider to find out what kinds of programming you can receive, and what equipment you need to receive it. For more information, visit www.dtv.gov



## More accidents?

One of our readers dropped by the Bookshop this week and asked an excellent question: Why doesn't The Times report on traffic accidents in the neighborhood?

That's a great question, so I thought I'd share the answer with our readership as a whole.

We don't cover most accidents for a simple reason: most traffic accidents are of questionable news value and are difficult to report in a timely manner.

Let's start by looking at what makes accidents hard to cover as news.

In North Carolina, the investigation of traffic accidents is the job of the State Highway Patrol [SHP], as opposed to the Sheriff. The SHP has thus far not seen fit to develop any readily accessible reporting mechanism on the accidents that occur in a particular area. The only practical way to find out what accidents they have investigated would be to pay a regular personal visit to the SHP office in Aberdeen and ask to check their recently-filed accident reports and sort through them to find the accidents of interest. At present, an in-person visit is the only way to extract information from the SHP; they choose not to supply information by phone, fax, email, or internet.

Even a regular visit to SHP would be a hit-ormiss proposition, since the timeframe for the filing of accident reports is a bit unpredictable. SHP has a few more than 1,800 Troopers covering 78,000 miles of road around the clock. They often work unusual shifts.

It is very common for a reporter to hear about an accident, contact the SHP office, and find out the report hasn't been filed and the Trooper won't be on duty again for three or four days. That means no opportunity to obtain a report or speak with the officer who investigated the accident for a number of days.

Depending on when the accident happens during the two week Seven Lakes Times production cycle, we may not be able to obtain information in time to include it the upcoming issue. So, if we pursue the story, we may eventually publish it three or four weeks after it happens.

That brings us to news value. A story about a traffic accident that happened on Seven Lakes Drive three weeks ago is not, in the mind of our editor, news. It's more like "olds."

There are daily — and even some weekly newspapers that make something of a art out of timely coverage of traffic accidents. They do this by keeping a police scanner turned on in the newsroom or on the belt of a reporter or photographer who is charged with listening for accident reports and racing to the scene to interview the Trooper on site.

This sort of dedication to accident coverage is beyond the resources of *The Times*, and, in fact, fewer and fewer newspapers are choosing to make the investment in this sort of coverage.

Like us, they have decided that, while almost everyone is curious about traffic accidents, in fact, our readers are better served if we focus our resources on covering the deliberations and decisions of local government and the landowners associations, providing interesting features on local personalities, and letting folks know about local events.

Our thanks to the reader who asked about this; if you have a question about Times coverage, give us a shout.

## Mamel supports NCDOT Crossing project

Open Letter to NCDOT:

Thank you for providing me with the opportunity to submit input regarding the proposed public crossing in Seven Lakes. As a nine-year resident of Seven Lakes West, I heartily endorse the proposal to upgrade and make public the railroad crossing in Seven Lakes.

I feel I can address the proposal with a reasonable degree of intelligence. During my threeyear tenure as President of the Seven Lakes West Landowners Association and Chair of its Board of Directors, I received many complaints related to the vehicle congestion caused by the outbound configuration of the crossing and also the potentially hazardous turns required to cross the track as a result of the immediate turns, both right and left, from Highway 211.

Fortunately, no resident of our community was injured during my term of office, and as a result, neither the Board nor the developer was involved in litigation. However, at that time, the Board also recognized that the developer accepted responsibility and liability for the safety and security of the residents/non-residents as a result of their original agreement to pay the necessary easement/access fee to the railroad. The developer continues to have this responsibility.

It is also interesting for me to note that at this date, the appointed county manager, in concert with the elected Commissioners of Moore County, have publicly abdicated their responsibility and stewardship for the safety and welfare of a population of Moore County, specifically, those residing in Seven Lakes West.

This lack of support has been indicated despite the fact that the County approved the Seven Lakes West subdivision in 1979, with full knowledge that when fully built out, there could be as many as 1700 or more households located there.

Given the documented mission or charter established for the governing bodies of North Carolina counties, it appears that the term "malfeasance" could/should be applied to their behavior as our appointed and elected representatives. Therefore, we sincerely need your help as you represent the State of NC, in which we are also residents.

Further, it is unfortunate that the concept of mitigation should affect the decision to upgrade the crossing. It is understandable and acceptable when applied to reducing the size of wetlands, as their reduction directly impacts the environment. But when the safety and welfare of thousands of human beings, including school children on buses, are compromised by a quid pro quo requirement which benefits a few, it is difficult to comprehend the reasoning behind that requirement. However, given the criteria noted on your website page entitled "Closing Crossings," I am encouraged by the fact that the proposed upgrading meets several of the criteria as listed under the sub-headings of 'Candidates for Closure" and "Project Evaluation Process."

Although there are other entities outside the boundaries of the Seven Lakes community who also use the crossing, I have not addressed their plight as they most likely will plead their case to you with considerably more pertinent information than that available to me. I trust you will represent the residents of Seven Lakes West appropriately

and take whatever steps are necessary to insure the safety and welfare of those utilizing the Seven Lakes railroad crossing. If I can be of any assistance to you to successfully complete the proposed project, please do not hesitate to call upon me.

Food Lion are great," Feggeler told *The Times*. "They'll tell me about specials that I might have missed. They know what I'm looking for."

In addition, five Food Pantry volunteers work in rotation to pay a call on Food Lion every day of the year but Christmas Day — when the store is closed — to collect meats and baked goods that have reached their expiration dates and that the store can no longer sell. These are transported back to the Food Pantry and immediately frozen. They can then be included in the mixed boxes of food for the next distribution day.

Feggler told *The Times* that the food contributed through the Post Offices was welcome indeed. "That was a tremendous amount of food they donated," he said.

He said the Pantry welcomes ongoing donations of food or monetary contributions throughout the year — though he notes that monetary donations are "more efficient."

Because the Pantry is often able to buy food at lower cost than the average grocery store customers — whether through the Food Bank or just through smart shopping — Feggeler can stretch the food dollar just about as far as it can be stretched.



Monday that she had received 350 emails and letters so far on the project, which she said was well in excess of the typical response for a project of this kind.

Horne had also received a petition signed by Seven Lakes West Landowners supporting the project.

She could not provide an estimate of the number of correspondents for and against the plan, but noted that one individual from West End was planning to hand-carry letters opposing the project to Raleigh on Tuesday.

Horne told *The Times* that she had the January 15 Moore County Board of Commissioners Work Session on her calendar and Chairman Nick Picerno confirmed that the invitation had gone out on December 19.

"I want to be able to ask the source," Picerno told *The Times* on Monday.

"What's this project about? What are the facts? Why do we have to have these closings?"

"I have a whole list of questions. I know the other board members want to ask questions as well."

Picerno said he personally had received nearly one hundred emails concerning the crossing project.

"I want every commissioner to have a chance to ask questions, learn the facts and make a good decision from the facts."

Picerno said he was interested in learning about the volume of traffic that uses the various crossings involved.

Noting that public safety is always a paramount concern,

he said he had asked the county's Public Safety Director, Carlton Cole, to contact West End Fire and Rescue in order to understand that organization's position on the NCDOT pro-

posal

"We're going to look into it — look into the facts and take the proper course of action," Picerno said.

rather serve as a planning tool.

"The survey is to assist the Board with prioritizing spending," said Zielsdorf, "However, it will be meaningless unless we get a good response from the community."

The questionnaire is divided into three parts and several broad categories. Using a simple 1-2-3 rating scale, section one lists assets individually and asks respondents to rate by frequency of use and value of importance. Section two addresses the eight focus areas developed by the Community Planning Committee in their ten-year planning initiative. In contrast, the final section zeroes in on several specific short term decisions related to the gates, roadside mowing, the stables, and yard debris site.

"We are looking for consensus among residents of what costs they would be willing to cut. Individually they are a drop in the bucket; but, taken together, they could accumulate into a significant amount," explained Zielsdorf. "The whole point of the survey is to look for room in the budget to insert for road paving funds."

The Association has been building up reserve funds for big ticket items, like paving. Zielsdorf said he believes it will make better economic sense to pave all the roads at once using a down payment from the reserve and funding from a ten or twenty-year loan. Any savings realized through options suggested in the survey could be used to satisfy monthly debt payments.

"You pay a premium only paving a few miles at a time," Zielsdorf explained. "Trying to do a little and pay as you go is like a dog chasing his tail — by the time you have enough to pave four miles, another section is already in bad shape."

Zielsdorf continued, "For the survey, I didn't want to have any sacred cows. We should not be afraid to ask the questions."




