Board okays expansion of SLLA equestrian program

Seven Lakes Landowners Association [SLLA] Stables Manager Kate Pennington wants to

Foxfire, County continue talks on water system merger

Foxfire Village and Moore County continue to work toward a merger of the Village

and County water systems. Council members Steve Durham and Leslie Frusco, along with water Superintendent Jon Sedlak recently met with Moore County Public Works Director Randy Gould, County Manager Wayne Vest, and County Commissioner Larry Caddell to continue discussions on the proposed merger.

"We still have a little more work to do, but I thought the meeting went well," Durham reported. "The

Wedding prompts discussion of park rules

A new generation of creative brides is seeking less conventional sites for weddings

and receptions. One Seven Lakes bride recently enquired about having her wedding at Foxfire Village Green Municipal Park.

The request was open for consideration at the Thursday, June 27 Foxfire Work Session as the board discussed appropriate fees, limited parking, weather contingencies, and additional security.

Parking Limited

Earlier in the month Village Clerk Lisa Kivett contacted Council Member Mick McCue to ask whether there is adequate parking for such a large event.

Sufficient parking has been a problem for past events, said Council Member Vic

During the Kids Fishing Tournament in honor of former Village Police Chief Rick Rhyne, there was damage to the sidewalks and also sprinkler heads, Koos said.

"I totally believe in this activity," he explained. "I also believe in someone having a wedding. We should let them have it. If it doesn't rain, they can park on the grass. The grass will come back. We can mark the sprinkler heads."

Rules needed?

"It comes down to some really basic issues for me," Councilman Steve Durham

"We shouldn't have any rules or ordinances that we can't enforce. If we have limited parking, and we are concerned about overflow parking, then we should say events can only occur if cars don't exceed the number of parking lots."

McCue agreed with Durham that the rules should be specific, applicable, and made clear up front.

"Let's take the wedding just as an example," McCue said. "Is that something you want to happen — and I think that we do. We go to them and ask, what is your parking plan? If you have 100 people coming, then you can have 10 parked cars. You are going to have to have a contingency plan or a bus to bring in your guests."

Proximity of the park to residential housing was also a concern for Councilwoman Leslie Frusco.

"Do we want establish the same hours — 'from dawn to dusk' — for special events that is already in place?" Frusco asked.

No need to reinvent the wheel

Mayor George Erickson reminded the Council that many of their concerns had been addressed years ago when the park was complet-

"The original Park Committee created and adopted the rules," Erickson said. "Public use of the park is dawn to dusk. But the rules do state that exceptions can be made with special permission. Lisa can email a copy of what the rules are."

"You can say it, but, if you don't do something to enforce it, it's kind of a moot point," Frusco said. "Do we want to have a chain across the gate?"

Frusco suggested that the Village should require a deputy on duty during the major events. The Council agreed that weddings would fall under the \$500 special use fee, and that a separate charge to rent the pavilions would also apply.

Exploring options for Woodland Circle property

The Village currently owns a large tract of land in Woodland Circle. The Council discussed what might be the best way to market or utilize the acreage. Mayor Erickson suggested that the land could possibly create revenue for the Village if utilized as a solar farm.

Frusco presented a draft of three possible options, including the solar farm, for the Council members to read and consider at their convenience.

"The land also has the potential to be some type of residential, townhome property, or assisted living facility," Frusco said.

'My thought is to target bigger developers and home builders," she expplained. "We could expand that with a little effort and investigate on the web to find other interests. We could write a proposal and send it to peoplewho build and operate assisted living facilities in the state.'

New pastor at Bensalem inherits a pulpit

On January 29, 1756 the Reverend Hugh McAden, a Presbyterian missionary struck out for the Sandhills of North Carolina to preach the gospel the Gaelic-speaking Highland Scots who had settled in the area.


"Preached on Thursday to a small congregation, mostly Highlanders, who were very much obliged to me for coming and highly pleased with my discourse," McAden wrote in his journal.

Aware that some in that congregation had passed the night at a nearby tavern, drinking and using strong language, he went on to write, "though, alas, I am afraid it was all feigned and hypocritical."


Holy Intentions

A few years later, another Presbyterian, John Bethune, sought to bring temperance and the gospel to Moore County's Highland Scots.

To that end, he helped establish three churches that survive to this day: Bensalem (originally called Ottery) near Eagle Springs; Culdee near Eastwood, and Bethesda in Aberdeen. But his loyalty to the British King put him at odds with the Revolutionary Whigs, and he was captured in 1776 at the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge outside

of Wilmington.

Even without Bethune at the helm the three churches survived. Early on, Ottery struggled with operations and record keeping. Holding a strict line on misconduct Ottery, lost several offenders to the more lenient Baptists.

A Peaceful Rechristening

Ottery worked diligently to establish itself. But not until 1835, when the church was admitted to the Fayetteville Presbytery were better order and better records kept. To complete the transformation, Ottery was rechristened Bensalem, Hebrew for Son of Peace. Yet others insist that the meaning is Hill of Peace. Regardless "peace" was the word of the day.

Church records from the

nineteenth century reveal far more than attendance and tithes. The church played a crucial role in holding souls to the straight and narrow. Indiscretions ranging from profanity to dancing were brought before the church elders.

It is not known whether the elders had a change of heart or were tired of losing good Scots to the more forgiving Baptists. Regardless, they eventually softened and pardoned many transgressions requiring only simple penitence and encouragement to do better.

From Vines to Oaks

Structure and good records provided Bensalem's congregation consistency and order.

The congregation was also in need of physical structure. The original brush arbor was updated into a hewn log one room building with a dirt floor. As the community became more established, so did the need for a sounder building.

In the late 1850s the beloved "Old Bensalem" was built on a foundation of large stones. But, on the night of

March 7, 1958 Old Bensalem ness. burned to the ground, leaving only the faithful and dedicated congregation. By morning, local men began the work of clearing way debris and preparing the ground to rebuild.

Jim & Estella Williams' sons Arthur, Roy, James, and Foster Williams provided the lumber for the rebuilding of Bensalem Church. They were all in the logging busi-

Nancy Williams Green, granddaughter of Jim and Estella, talked about the fire: "The gazebo near the cemetery sits on the site of where the old building stood. The pulpit was the only thing that was saved from the fire."

Growing in Grace


The "new" Bensalem is today already a historic building with unique and original architecture. The sharply arched gothic doors open into a beautiful sanctuary. The pitched ceiling and walls are richly planked with aged oak. Sunlight streams through the updated stained

It is Sunday morning and the pews are filled with fourth and fifth generation descendants of the original Highland Scots, as well as more recent transplants from across the

The congregation starts each Sunday off with a big breakfast at 9:15 am. Sunday school classes take turns preparing the meal. Breakfast is followed by Sunday school at 10:00 am and Worship Service at 11:00 am.

After the service, Mathew and Laura Cosner stay behind to complete the last minute details for Vacation Bible School. Laura grew up

"I went to church all my life and I got married here," she says. "My grandfather Arthur Williams helped build the church. It is so family-oriented. We all care deeply about one another, and it is evident. Bensalem is there to catch you when you fall."

Cosner sums up Bensalem perfectly: a healthy blend of history and present. Across the drive, tucked behind the fellowship hall, is a large picnic shelter, playground, swings, and basketball goal.

Cosner insists that everyone, including new members, is family.

"It feels like we are all related," she says. "We are in sync with one another and you can just feel the love."

Filling a Need

Pastor Mark Carver experienced that love when he was welcomed into the Bensalem family many years ago. Filling in for a retired pastor, he and his family grew to love Bensalem. The feeling was mutual and Bensalem wanted him to become their pastor.

"They asked me to come out and fill the pulpit on Sundays and provide pastoral care," Carver explained. "I served in that capacity from 2004 to 2006, when they asked me if I would like to be full-time. After three years, an interim is not allowed to take over as pastor. I was told that I had to go."

— had now become a stumbling block. Gone were the days when a well-liked pastor could show up to preach and be hired by the congregation.

Carver respected the Presbyterian Church's authority, and another pastor was appointed for Bensalem.

Carver and his wife Theresa and their children moved to Richmond County, where Carver was employed as a Hospice Chaplain. It was six years later when he received a call from Bensalem. He was told that the previous pastor had left, and he was asked if he was interested in coming back.

"It was a long process," Carver said of his nine year journey to officially filling the Bensalem pulpit. "The upside is we tried to do things decently and in order. Even though it has been six to seven years, I was still getting calls for weddings, baptisms, and funerals. We had made so many good friends out here."

There is still a house to sell and another move to complete. But the Carvers are not sweating the details.

"I am elated," Carver said.
"We are very happy to be back."

The Gray Havens - folk pop with a side of jazz

When *Times* readers last encountered Dave Radford, he was a 17-year-old "crooner" singing his heart out on the television set, competing as a finalist in the fifth season of the enormously popular American Idol program.

Radford, the grandson of Loren and Judy Swearingen of Seven lakes North, didn't make it all the way to the grand prize of that competition, but his musical career has continued and, recently, taken off in an exciting new direction.

Radford and his wife Licia just completed their first tour performing as The Gray Havens, a "folk-pop" duo, promoting their newlyreleased CD "Where Eyes Don't Go."

The tour took them all the way from their home in the Chicago suburbs to a church in Brooklyn, NY, and the welcome they received from fans along the way proved something of a surprise to the couple.

Plugging into an online new music community called NoiseTrade, they built a database of several thousand listeners, Dave Radford told *The Times*. When they let those folks know they were interested in touring, invitations came from all over, and they assembled a collection of gigs in the Pennsylvania and New York areas, playing colleges, churches, and house concerts.

"We were really happy with it," Radford said. "The families that hosted us were very generous, as were churches and colleges. We were overwhelmed and surprised by how much people want to give and help -- particularly younger start-up artists like

sails silently on the warm thermals. It is an art to read the wind. Circling birds know the secret of lift rising with ease on warmer air.

"I look to the trees, grasses, and birds to find lift," Jason Scribner says, with his eyes to the heavens while standing with his feet firmly planted on ground. "It is like looking

for a needle in a haystack. It is part luck and part The silhouette of the glider instinct. It's almost Zen-like; and, for just a second, you feel like you have conquered nature.'

> It is easy to over compensate — creating such a graceful arc, one naturally thinks, should warrant a grand flourish on the remote control's joy stick. But less is more, and a gentle touch is the mark of a skilled pilot.

The peaceful, overcast, cool June morning should be calming. But two local Cub Scout troops are giddy with anticipation to have their chance to fly a remote controlled airplane.

The Seven Lakes Aeromodeler's Club has graciously hosted the event as a thank you to the den leaders of two

local packs who are also National Guard Staff Sergeants: David Watts and Aron Butler. Watts & Butler make it possible for the club to use the National Guard facility in Southern Pines during the cooler months.

The whole club has turned out, happy to chaperone and share their knowledge. The

spectator area is mowed and clean.

The planes themselves are surprisingly quiet, and birds can be heard singing in the nearby woods. There is a corrugated building with a television and flight simulator. a grill cooking hotdogs, and an ice chest full of soda and

kid want?

Aeromodelers President Roger Casavant insists that safety comes first. The rules of flying etiquette are designed to promote safety. The operator must announce when he is coming onto the field, and only one or two planes fly at a time.

Casavant introduced his own children to model airplanes. "When I first started, my kids were young," he said. "Radio Control was introduced in the seventies."

Glider pilot Scribner wasn't much older when his father, Louie Scribner, first introduced him to remote control gadgets.

The radio-controlled planes come in all sorts of shapes, sizes, and colors.

No doubt Scribner's dad Louie had found the right bait to bring his son back into the aeromodeler's fold. Little did he suspect that his son would soon become a strong competitor.

"Gliding bit me even harder," Scribner said. "It's totally quiet. With gliders, it is you against the wind. Birds have instincts that far surpass what I have."

On the field, Scribner demonstrates. He holds the plane with an extended arm and turns in quick circles. He seamlessly slings the glider up. It lifts and Scribner is silent searching for that illusive thermal column.

In the aeromodeler's world, before you fly it, you must build it.

"When I was a kid, I started with a little rubber-bandpowered model; and, by my teens, I had progressed to gas-powered," Walt Dower said. Building the planes





firm, sweetly tart, and intense.

Trying a wedge of Winblo, Charles Lambert clearly appreciates its perfection and spears a second piece. Lambert, a Robbins resident, retired Moore County Schools Principal, and active member of the School Board, is enjoying a carefree summer day, picking up ice cream for his family.

Not to be left out, young Phillip Thompson tries a slice of peach. He smiles, sticky with ice cream. His straight As earned him a \$25 award from Central Electric. A seasoned wake boarder, he is preparing for his first competition in September.

"It took me five minutes to learn how to wake board," he explains. "I like fresh water better, salt water makes me itch."

Young and old alike sit in

swings, metal gliders, and at picnic tables, quietly enjoying their ice cream. Children play tag and a mother gleans her minivan's cup holders and car seats for silver to buy her little girl another serving.

Eating a lot of ice cream for a great cause

Katie Tucker and Kenzie Jones are cousins and best friends for life.

Growing up in the tight-knit, supportive Eagle Springs Community, they learned early on the virtues of friendship. When Jones felt the call to help feed hungry children, after reading the book *Kisses from Katie*, Tucker was ready to help.

Jones already knew exactly which hungry children she wanted to help. Christening her endeavor "The Breakfast Project," she aims to raise \$4,800 to provide a group of Haitian school children breakfast for a year. Currently, the children are subsisting on one meal a day.

The Haiti Connection

Jones already had a Haiti connection; her mother, Sylvia Pusser, sponsors a child in Haiti. Pusser, a retired professor from St. Andrews College has traveled to the island nation four times. She dreams of helping to build a school for the Haitian community.

Pusser's commitment to Haiti has grown into a family and community endeavor. Her husband Nelson, a farmer who works for Coastal Agrobusiness in Carthage, recently traveled to Haiti with Sylvia to help teach better farming practices.

Haiti is a rugged, mountainous country on the island of Hispaniola. Before European exploration, it was a lush, peaceful country inhabited by the indigenous Taino/Arawak. Under first Spanish and then French rule the Taino/Arawak were enslaved and exterminated through ruthless mistreatment. African Slaves were then imported as the unpaid labor force.

The Haitian French Colonial Period is infamous for its brutality and inhumane treatment of slaves. The poorest of poor worked the fields to produce luxury crops of sugar, coffee, and tobacco for French consumers. After hundreds of years of exploita-

tion, poor land management, and civil unrest, subsistence farming in Haiti is difficult at best.

Sylvia Pusser plans to return to Haiti in August, and her daughter's goal is to have raised \$4,800 in Breakfast Project funds for her mother to take with her.





(Continued from page 7) vocals have a subtlety and freedom that is very rare in the folk-pop world.

The song "Gray Flowers" starts with a comfortably folky guitar strum, but by the second bar of the vocals you know you are on some very unique, very jazz-inflected terrain. Even the sweet jangle-pop "Let's Get Married," has those jazzy vocal touches that make the Havens' sound distinctive.

Story and allegory

That's the music; the lyrics are just as unique. Dave Radford's songwriting tells stories, but those stories live in worlds of the imagination that aren't quite this world. Often verging on the surreal, the images pile up like scenes from one of Bob Dylan's epic yarns or Van Morrison's hymns to the silence.

"I love narrative, fiction stories, CS Lewis and Tolkein," Radford told *The Times*. "Story is what draws me in — and I'm not alone in that. We live in a culture that is obsessed with story. And I am a very visually oriented thinker. I'm trying to illustrate the thing in my mind."

Asked about the use of allegory, Radford said, "Some people are perhaps tired of being directly hit over the head with an idea. So, to speak of things indirectly, sometimes allows the listener to feel the idea or whatever you are trying to convey — and piercingly, if it is sung about or written about in an indirect way."



melody that I like, and then start thinking about lyrics. The ideas that come to my mind in that moment are a compilation of all my experiences and everything that I believe."

"Whatever anyone holds most strongly is going to come out, whatever they do," he said. "That would be true of my music as well. At the same time, it's not contrived. I wouldn't know what else to write and be genuine."



Battling the prickles for black raspberries

My legs and arms are covered with small red pricks and scratches, and not because I fell into a prickly pear.

It's berry-picking season, and I have been doing my part to increase the family intake of the powerful antioxidants reputed to lie inside the deep purple skins of blackberries and raspberries.

My love affair with berrypicking began long before anyone had ever heard of antioxidants.

My grandmother lived ten miles up a mountain and three miles down a dirt road, in the epicenter of Smith Ridge, Virginia.

Across the road from her house was a big thicket of black raspberries. These are not the blackberries one finds scattered along the roadsides of the North Carolina Piedmont, but a different — and much finer — species altogether. Nor are they the red raspberries that get more press, despite tasting a bit like cough syrup.

No, the black raspberry is, for my money, the king of berries.

My greatest joy in childhood was to visit my grandmother when the raspberries were ripe. I'd fidget and fret until the grown-ups finally gave my cousins and me permission to cross the road and nick berries

Mawmaw (that's what I called my grandmother) would inevitably shout out: "You children watch out for snakes. If you smell cucumbers, you'd better run!"



Copperheads, the most common of the poisonous snakes in those parts, are reputed to smell like cucumbers. I have caught and relocated a few copperheads in my time, and I haven't noticed the smell. On the other hand, I didn't get close enough to those snakes to smell behind their ears, so maybe I missed the scent.

The cousins and I would emerge from the thicket an hour or so later with a can half full of berries (the other half having been consumed on the spot), clothes stained purple, and plenty of scratches on our arms and legs.

I just spent the Fourth of July holiday acquiring a fresh batch of those scratches, along with two gallons of black raspberries, which have been turned into freezer jam. Freezer jam has a higher fruit to sugar ratio, and is cooked not much at all. It tastes more like berries than sugar, which is why I prefer it — though you do have to have a freezer in which to

store the finished product.

My mother made biscuits my last day in Virginia. There's not much finer eating than

black raspberry jam on a hot, buttered, homemade biscuit.

My raspberry scratches overlaid nicely the batch I acquired the week before, picking North Carolina blackberries nearer home. I read that the sharp pointy things on the canes of the blackberry aren't true thorns, but rather "prickles." I'm not at all sure my skin can tell the difference.

Blackberry jam isn't as popular in my family as raspberry, strawberry, and blueberry, so I save the sugar it would take to make jam and simply freeze the blackberries whole on a cookie sheet.

I vacuum-seal the frozen berries in one- and two-cup quantities, and use them in the winter on oatmeal and in smoothies. If you happen to stop along some roadside to pick some berries of your own, and aren't quite sure what you've got in your hand, here's a tip.

It turns out one of the key differences in raspberries and blackberries is the fate of something called the "torus." That's the pale-colored protrusion in the center of the berry that attaches it to the plant. When you pick a blackberry, the torus comes

along for the ride. When you pick a ripe raspberry, the torus stays on the cane, leaving a hollow berry.

I haven't picked any blueberries yet; I hope to find some this weekend, so there's plenty of jam to go around this winter. I haven't found a roadside patch of wild blueberries yet, so I pay to pick those.

The "free" blackberries and raspberries that I pick, I pay for with scratches and blood.

Close encounter with soccer great

Having been an avid soccer fan my entire adult life, you can imagine my surprise to see Clint Dempsey in a local grocery store. Playing for the Tottenham Hotspurs in North London, he has become arguably the most successful U.S. Soccer player to play in the English Premier League.

Clint started life in Texas and was a top youth and collegiate player before joining the New England Revolution in the MLS. In 2007, he was recruited by Fulham in the English Premier League and became their all time leading scorer before being bought by Tottenham, a top club in the world. He has also become the leader for U.S. Men's National Soccer Team which has had many successes.

Clint is preparing to return to London for pre-season training and explained that he was in the area visiting in-laws.

It was easy for me to recognize him because I see him on television over 30 times a year. On my short "bucket list" I hope to get to London this year and watch him live, Tottenham tickets can be very hard to acquire.

In closing, I would like to add that Mr. Dempsey was extremely polite and cordial to take a few moments to visit with a fan. We can all be proud to have a young man like him representing the U.S. at the highest level in sports.

SOS presents session on Civil War battle

The Battle of Monroe's Crossroads, fought about eight miles east of presentday Southern Pines on March 10, 1865 was one of the last great cavalry battles of the Civil War.

Because it occurred as the war was winding down, and because the site is now in a restricted area of the Fort Bragg Military Reservation, this battle has never been afforded the historical significance that it deserves.

Save Our Sandhills President Joe McDonald will share the story of this battle on Thursday, July 25, from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm at the Southern Pines Elks Lodge, 280 Country Club Circle (former Southern Pines Country

McDonald will describe how the Confederate and Union forces moved through the Southern Pines and Aberdeen areas to set the scene for the battle and how the subsequent events transpired.

There was a stellar cast of characters. All of the principal cavalry commanders in the eastern region of the country were present.

On the Confederate side were Lt. General Wade Hampton, Major General Joseph Wheeler, and Major General Matthew C. Butler. On the Union side was Brevet Major General Hugh Judson Kilpatrick and his brigade commanders.

All together, 4,000 to 5,000 men participated.

This battle saw some of the

most intense and bloody hand-to-hand combat that had been seen in the entire course of the war.

One historian noted that had this battle been fought in Northern Virginia in 1862, it would be a household word

And finally, the battle had considerable strategic significance. It delayed Kilpatrick's arrival in Fayetteville and thus afforded the Confederate infantry under Lt. General Hardee time to safely get across the Cape Fear River, and it probably gave the Confederate forces the opportunity to put up more resistance at Averasboro and Bentonville.

McDonald is a native of Moore County, born in a

house on Bethesda Road near Southern Pines that was built by an ancestor prior to the Revolutionary War (and which was visited by Union troops on their way to Monroe's Crossroads). He has had a lifelong interest in local his-



(Continued from front page) could increase proportionately if the County's water rates increased.

The County is preparing an application for a zero percent interest loan, aiming for a September deadline.

"It might be a good time to have [Randy Gould] come back for another meeting and act relatively quickly," Durham advised. "This has been my position from the beginning. Clearly, this is in the best interest of Foxfire going forward, pending financial feasibility. If Foxfire wants to be a part of this funding we need to make a decision soon. Zero percent financing is about as good as it gets."

Frusco said securing the funding will be a long process.

"It will take months to get a funding packet through," she said. "They are not even expecting to have the funding until next Spring. Then engineering and everything else has to be done. Time wise, if we are going to be prudent about this, we should schedule a meeting to garner public input in the next couple of weeks" Frusco said.

"The financing would be zero percent," she added, "and you can't get much better than that, as Steve said."

"We have some questions to make sure how we would want the financing to be handled with our residents and whether it will pass with our local government commission. This is something we should try to resolve in the next couple of days.'

Public input concerning water set for July 25

The board compared calendars and decided the best date to hold the meeting would during the next regularly scheduled Council Work Session on Thursday, July 25. The location of the meeting would move from the Village Offices to the Village Hall.

Could water deal hinder growth?

Mayor Erickson raised several concerns about the proposed merger of the water

"I have a couple of issues on approving and moving forward," Erickson said. "I would like to see what contract that they draw up, one for our attorney to review and copies for each of us as well.'

"The other thing is, somehow in the details, I think we need to work out and discuss a request to allow for continued annexation in the future, so that the County is not going to be able to say, you can't annex them and give them water. Somehow, in working out the language, it doesn't limit us to 5,500 acres, what we have now, and that we can continue to grow."

Annexations can be expensive

Past voluntary annexations by the Village have proven expensive, Frusco said.

"I think we need to be very careful about future annexations," she said. "We can get ourselves into a situation where someone wants to be annexed, and we are then responsible for [the infrastructure costs even though it is] one house actually being built instead of the promised fifty. As soon as they put up one home, then the Village has the responsibility of maintaining the streets, mowing, and providing security."

"There is so much land that already exists in Foxfire Village, I can't envision developing all the vacant land with in the corporate village," Frusco said. "I can't imagine it being developed in the next 50 years."

Erickson disagreed.

"We said that years ago, and then we ended up with 100 houses being built in a year," he said. "I would rather have us at 5,500 acres than the 2,100 acres we had in 2003.

"I think, long term, it would be more beneficial to our community than to restrict ourselves to 2,100 acres. That's why I have supported that growth for our community over the long term in its hinder water negotiations. best interest."

Water is priority

No request for annexation into the Village has been denied since 2003. Durham advised developing a strategy for addressing future annex-

"If we are just going to sit back and say we will just deal with requests of annexation one at a time, it is a little short sighted," Durham said. "I agree with George that we shouldn't do anything to limit our ability to annex. That I agree with."

However, Durham disagreed with allowing questions about annexation to

Water Interrupted

Unusually heavy rain fall has resulted in less residential irrigation — enough less that there was no shortage of water during the four days that the Village's Well #10 on Hoffman Road across from Grand Pines was out of serv-

"The motor burned out," Durham reported. "Jon [Sedlak, Water Superintendent] said he was not sure what caused the failure. It could have been mechanical or lightning. We just received the bill, in excess of \$6,000."

(Continued from page 25) Deadline approaching on Foxtail Circle

An October deadline is rapidly approaching for local developer and builder Ron Jackson, who must address the three unfinished foundations on Foxtail Lane that were abandoned more than a decade ago.

In April, Jackson was given notice by certified letter that he had six months to correct or rectify the unsightly and hazardous construction site.

In an attempt to comply Jackson offered to give the properties to Foxfire Village. A discussion of how to respond to that offer was included in the published agenda for the Tuesday, July 9 meeting of the Foxfire Village Council.

But, when the item came up, Tuesday night, Mayor George Erickson said that it was premature to have included the item on the agenda and that it would be better discussed during a Council Work Session with the Village's attorney, Michael Brough, in attendance.

"It should be discussed at our next work session," Erickson said. "I think we need to go to Mr. Brough about

*

this issue and spend some time discussing it."

But, before the Council moved on to other agenda items, Councilman Mick McCue made clear his stance on the issue.

"We can not take on more debt in order to sell property," he said.

Two lots with in the Jackson property are currently involved in a bankruptcy. If ownership were transferred to the Village, the Village would be responsible for the

McCue concluded: "If it is so easy to sell that piece of property, then let Mr. Jackson. He should do it to avoid penalties in the future."

Councilman Steve Durham concurred with McCue, saying, "I couldn't agree more." After the meeting, Councilwoman Leslie Frusco told The Times: "He (Ron Jackson) wants to give it to us. But two plots are secured by debt. Unless the bank resolves the debt, we absorb that debt. As Mick said, we are out of the debt service business."

If it accepted the lots, the Village would also be financially responsible for removing the foundations.

Rarely Used Municipal Absentee Voting Rescinded

Only twenty-six citizens have utilized absentee voting during the last four Foxfire Village municipal elections, and 20 of those occurred in 2007. There were six absentee ballots in 2011 and none in 2005 and 2009.

The Council passed unanimously a resolution rescinding absentee voting for municipal elections. The resolution will be sent to the Moore County Board of Elections.

"When we discussed this during the Work Session, we found it would be a significant cost saving to the Village of \$700," Frusco explained.

During the Work Session, Councilman McCue had suggested that the Village could offer to drive anyone who need transportation to a voting station.

Under budget

"All departments are under budget," Frusco said, reviewing the financial report. "We ended the past fiscal year on a very good note, and that's the way we will pursue the current fiscal year."

Rain Delays

Recent heavy rains have delayed paving projects, Councilman Vic Koos said.

"The asphalt company doesn't make asphalt when it is raining," he said. "The paving company is slightly behind because of what is going on."

The rainfall has also caused drainage problems that could further delay paving, Koos explained.

Tentatively, I have Deer Track and Burning Tree Place rescheduled for paving," he said. "I say 'tentatively,' because we have had draining problems come up with rain. I have to determine what needs to be done with drainage, and if it is Village's or resident's responsibility for fixing it."





SLLA asks residents to help control hydrilla

Hydrilla is spreading in North Carolina and is difficult to control. It can be spread by water fowl, boats, and through the watersheds. Routine monitoring to catch it early and the introduction of sterile grass carp is a good preventive strategy.

In May, Seven Lakes Landowners Association hired a professional lake management company to conduct monthly lake water quality tests and fishery and aquatic assessments.

This month they observed Hydrilla in a cove in Echo Lake, and have introduced sterile carp to help control this invasive weed.

What can you do to prevent the spread of hydrilla?

The spread of hydrilla from one body of water to another can be greatly reduced, if boaters remove all aquatic weeds from boats, trailers and fishing gear before leaving lakes, rivers, ponds and streams.

Hydrilla fragments attached to boat hulls and to trailers will spread the weed from one location to another.

After boating out of the community, boaters should always thoroughly wash their boats and trailers before launching into lakes at Echo or Sequoia. This also applies to canoes and kayaks.

dalism drove up maintenance expenses for the month of June," Director Leach reported.

"It is a difficult position to be in," he said.

"There are a lot of things that do require maintenance that we can't budget for, like storm damage and fallen trees."

"Vandalism continues to take a lot of our staff's time that could be directed elsewhere."

Carp introduced to control Hydrilla

Forty exotic sterile Asian carp have been introduced into Lake Echo to curtail, if not eliminate, the unwanted exotic aquatic plant hydrilla.

The carp graze solely on hydrilla, which was once a popular aquarium plant. The weed was introduced into the waterways of Florida when irresponsible residents dumped the contents of their old aquariums outside.

"The unfortunate thing is that it grows about foot a day in ideal conditions," Community Manager Ray Sohl explained. "It cannot be eradicated, but it can be controlled. Sterile carp 'cows' are vegetarians and will not impact our game fish, because they represent a different niche in the ecosystem.

"Foster Lake Management Company made its first inspection, and they did discover hydrilla in one cove in Lake Echo," Sohl reported.

One way to combat the spread of hydrilla is by care-(See "SLLA," p. **2**9)



fully washing boats, trailers, and fishing gear after they have been used in bodies of water outside Seven Lakes. (See box on page 28.)

Roadway pruning and trimming

The Emergency Medical Service and Firefighters require sixteen feet of overhead clearance along roadways, and SLLA streets are past due a trimming.

"The tree trimming proposal recommendation is to approve the lowest bidder, Superior Tree Company, and pay them \$1400 per day up to the budget of \$12,000 to trim all trees along highways," SLLA manager Ray Sohl reported.

Superior Tree will complete the work over the course of thirty days dependent on their schedule and other commitments.

"I recognize that on the South Side and some roads on North are pretty critical," Sohl said.

He also advised: "This should be a line item included each year in the budget, so

that this doesn't become the huge problem it is today, and we can approach it on an annual basis."

Treasurer Conrad Meyer agreed with Sohl's recommendation that trimming become a regular line item in each year's budget.

Moving toward a barcode-only system

The SLLA is taking the first step toward exercising better control over entry at the gates by disabling the barcodes of landowners whose account is more than sixty days delin-

The bar code system can be updated electronically to detect and prevent automatic entry by landowners and renters who are not current in their dues payments something that is much harder to achieve with windshield stickers.

The delinquent resident would be required to ask for a thirty-day hangtag pass and enter each time through the lefthand lane at the gate.

'We would not deny access to anyone," President Steve Ritter explained. "They would have to get a hanging thirty day pass."

"This is the first step in doing away with stickers and moving toward only barcodes," Manager Sohl added. "It will help improve security. The policy has been in place on many properties all over the country.'

"Eligibility to an amenity goes away when the account goes into arrears," Sohl said. "The barcodes only allow automatic entry for residents in good standing. They will be deactivated if resident is sixty days in arrears."

Volunteers needed

The Community Standards Committee needs several more volunteers, Director Bob Racine reported, adding that it is a hard but rewarding

"People are always asking what happens if they don't comply with the rules," Racine said. "Last month, a resident was cited for parking a vehicle off his approved driveway. He was told if it happens again he would be automatically fined \$100 a day without further warning.
